

from the City of Boston, Commonwealth of Massachusetts, and gave the address of 68 Pemberton Square and was on a letterhead purporting to be that of the Sacco-Vanzetti Defense Committee. That the said letter was signed by the said Frank J. Burke, heretofore referred to as the brother of the affiant.

THAT the subject matter of said letter was to the best of affiant's recollection, as follows, to wit: A statement by the said Frank J. Burke that he had been a witness to some shooting at South Braintree, Massachusetts on April 15th, 1920. That he had seen the both of the men that were held for trial in connection with the said shooting and that neither of the men were the men that he had seen at South Braintree on April 15th, 1920. That a trial was coming on at an early date and that he had told Fred H. Moore, one of counsel for the defendants that he had heard that one Roy E. Gould was a witness to said shooting and that the said Fred H. Moore had asked him to attempt to locate the said Gould. That he had made inquiries about said Gould and had learned that he went around the country with carnival companies and that he had made inquiry and had secured some hearsay information to the effect that the said Roy E. Gould was connected with some carnival company or show company operating in or about the City of Hartford, State of Connecticut, and that he requested the affiant to make inquiries relative to the whereabouts of said Gould and if he succeeded in locating the said Gould to then advise him or the said Fred H. Moore.

THAT pursuant to such request contained in said letter from the said Frank J. Burke, brother of the affiant, the affiant did make an effort to locate the said Gould in or about any carnival or show companies operating at or near the said City of Hartford, State of Connecticut.

THAT the affiant located some five or six different carnival and show companies operating in that district and made personal inquiries at or about each and all the said separate shows to locate

the said Gould.
