



TOWN OF PLYMOUTH.

PERMIT TO DIG CLAMS.

A Permit is hereby granted to

Bert Vanzetti, *Suozzi's Lane*

to dig clams within the limits of the TOWN OF PLYMOUTH under the following restrictions and conditions:

FIRST. The quantity of clams to be dug under this Permit shall not exceed ten (10) bushels, including shells, in any one week, except for seeding purposes.

SECOND. No Clams dug under this Permit shall be transported out of Plymouth or shall be sold or delivered to any person to be transported out of Plymouth.

THIRD. No Clams shall be dug on any flats or shore leased to any person or used for the purpose of the cultivation or the propagation of clams, or on which a close season has been set.

FOURTH. No clams shall be taken, the shell of which is less than two inches long, except for seeding purposes.

FIFTH. The holder of this Permit shall report in writing to the Supervisor of Shores and Flats each week the number of bushels of clams dug during the week.

SIXTH. This Permit shall expire May 1, 1920,

SEVENTH. This Permit may be revoked at any time by the Selectmen, at their pleasure, and shall be subject to any and all further restrictions and conditions adopted from time to time by the Selectmen.
