Dear Mr. Frederick:

Yesterday Mr. William G. Thompson, who argued the defendants' exceptions in the Sacco case, called my attention to the fact that on page 6 of the printed bill of exceptions it appears that it was agreed that the official stenographic record of the second trial in the case of Commonwealth vs. Madeiros might be referred to at the argument in the Full Court so far as material. Mr. Thompson, as I recall, said that he did not refer to it in his argument and that he did not think Mr. Ranney referred to it in his argument. I told him I would write you that if the Justices at any time called for this official stenographic record I would see that it was furnished without delay. If you think it necessary or advisable for me to send you this official stenographic record comprising three volumes, I will do so at once or will hold them in readiness subject to call from you.

I am writing this letter to you in accordance with promise I made to Mr. Thompson yesterday.
