





Record of the Two Thousand Six Hundred and Forty-Second (2642nd) Meeting of the Metropolitan District Commission duly called and held at 20 Somerset Street, Boston, Massachusetts, on Thursday, May 7, 1970, at 10:00 A.M.

Present, Commissioner Sears, and Associate Commissioners Haggerty, O'Brien, Rosenblatt and Breen.

The records of the preceding meeting were read and approved.

The Secretary submitted for signature the following papers which were signed by the Commissioner and four Associate Commissioners:

- 1 Contract number 1978, dated May 7, 1970, with J. L. Caputo Construction Co., Inc., & Builders Iron Works, Inc., for proposed reconstruction of southerly sidewalk of bridge over B & M Railroad, Winthrop Avenue, Revere Beach Parkway, Revere.
- 2 Concession permit to Drive-In Concessions, for operation of the refreshment facility located at 205 Nantasket Avenue, Hull, for a five-year period beginning January 1, 1970 and ending December 31, 1974.

3 **RELEASE**

VOTED to execute a Release to Howard Rubin and Edwin N. Sidman, Trustees, R & N Realty Trust, the right, if any, of the Commonwealth to enforce the 25-foot set-back restriction on land of said Trustees or such persons on Dedham Parkway in that part of Boston formerly Hyde Park, imposed by deeds as set forth in said Release.

- 4 At this point, a further discussion was held relative to a possible location for the new proposed skating rink in the City of Lynn, as called for under the provisions of Chapter 584 of the Acts of 1968. Following the discussion, the Commission V O T E D to rescind its actions taken on this matter on April 23, 1970 and April 30, 1970. The Commission further V O T E D: Secretary to invite the members of the Parks Commission and the City Planner of the City of Lynn to a meeting of the Commission for a discussion on the general subject.

Action was taken upon the following matters relating to the Sewerage Division:

- 5 Request, March 27, for preliminary approval of replacing linoleum flooring in laboratory, Nut Island Sewage Treatment Plant. Est. cost = \$2,000.00. The Commission V O T E D: Approved.
- 6 Request, March 27, for preliminary approval of retubing #2 Fire Tube Boiler, East Boston Pumping Station. Est. cost = \$6,500.00. The Commission V O T E D: Approved.

Action was taken upon the following matters relating to the Water Division:

- 7 Report, April 29, relative to consumption of water by the cities and towns in the Metropolitan Water District during the year 1969 for certification to the State Treasurer. The Commission V O T E D that the same be certified to the Treasurer and Receiver-General.
- 8 Letter of Attorney Gilman of The McLaughlin Brothers, April 27, submitting invoices in connection with claim of Sugarman Brothers & Statler Tissue Corporation re: M.D.C. water main break, January 3, 1968.

After a thorough discussion, the Commission V O T E D to authorize the Commissioner to notify the petitioners of the Commission's decision on this matter.

- 9 Reports, April 22 and January 22, relative to retaining the services of a consulting engineering firm to make an investigation and study regarding the advisability of adding the Towns of Avon, Braintree, Holbrook, Randolph, Stoughton and Weymouth to the Commission's Water District. The Commission V O T E D to authorize the Commissioner to proceed with the necessary steps to engage the services of a consulting engineering firm.

- 10 Report, May 5, recommending acquisition of former U.S.A.F. Gap Filler Annex in New Salem, for Water Division use. The Commission V O T E D: Approved as recommended.

- 1 Report, May 6, requesting permission to advertise as a "posted contract" the work necessary for the maintenance and operation of completed flood control projects. The Commission V O T E D: Approved.
 - 2 Report, May 4, requesting permission to requisition two stainless steel impellers for the main pumps, Deer Island Sewage Treatment Plant, at an estimated cost of \$25,625.00 each. The Commission V O T E D to rescind its vote of March 26, 1970 on this matter. The Commission further V O T E D: Authority given to requisition two stainless steel impellers at an estimated cost of \$25,625.00 each, as requested.
 - 3 Report, May 5, submitting for approval plans and specifications for construction of high and low service distribution lines from Shafts 8 and 9 of the City Tunnel Extension, Contract No. C-227; and requesting authority to advertise. The Commission V O T E D to approve the plans and specifications as submitted, and authority given to advertise.
- Action was taken upon the following matters relating to the Parks System:
- 4 Matter of review of acquisition of Peddocks Island by the Metropolitan District Commission. The Commission V O T E D to acquire Peddocks Island by eminent domain, or otherwise, with a proviso that present occupants of cottages thereon be allowed to remain for a period of ten years from the date of acquisition. Mr. Grigalus to prepare such papers as may be necessary. **Mr. Rosenblatt voted No.**
 - 5 Matter of reviving refreshment and skate rental concession at the Max Ulin Skating Rink, Milton. The Commission V O T E D to revive said concession and to issue a permit to David J. Kelleher for a period of five years, at an annual rental of \$300.00, or 10% of the gross receipts, whichever is greater, subject to the usual conditions, and with the proviso that the Commission shall reimburse Mr. Kelleher up to \$500.00 of the actual cost for certain improvements to the structure as outlined in letter of Mr. Kelleher dated April 14, 1970; such reimbursement to be given as a credit toward rental due on the basis of 20% each year for a five-year period.
 - 6 Matter of continued encroachment on M.D.C. land, Fellsway, Medford, at the Mystic River, by Russo's Marine Mart, Inc. After considerable discussion with Assistant Attorney General Walter H. Mayo III, and with Mr. John J. Grigalus present, the Commission V O T E D to leave the matter in the hands of the Attorney General and the Sheriff of Middlesex County; Commissioner to notify Mr. Russo accordingly.
 - 7 Letter of Hugh Mann Associates (by Helen Fenters), April 30, regarding the possibility of purchasing land on Lynn Fells Parkway, at Main Street, Melrose. The Commission V O T E D: Denied.
 - 8 Letter of Attorney John J. Sullivan, Jr., April 27, and supplemental letter, April 28, regarding setback restrictions in land in Hyde Park, in connection with the further development of the Georgetowne Houses Project by R & N Realty Trust (Howard Rubin and Edwin N. Sidman, Trs.). The Commission V O T E D: Approved, and to execute a Release of Restriction, subject to receipt of a letter from R & N Realty Trust (prior to delivery of said Release) stating that they would not apply for an additional driveway entrance from the M.D.C. or any other governmental agency or subdivision thereof, for access from the Dedham Parkway to the site of Georgetowne Houses. (See Page 1, Item 3)
 - 9 Request of Emerson College, May Day Plus 13 Committee, May 4, to use the Hatch Shell for their "Life In Concert" program on May 14, 1970. The Commission V O T E D: Denied.
 - 10 Letter of John F. Whitney, April 30, requesting that his concession permit dated January 3, 1966, for the Latta Memorial Swimming Pool, Somerville, be terminated as of April 30, 1970. The Commission V O T E D to grant the request to terminate the permit.
 - 11 The following schedules were approved by the Commissioner for the



- 1 Request of Cambridge Common Concert Committee, May 6, to hold Sunday afternoon rock concerts on Commission property in the Charles River Reservation, in the vicinity of Memorial Drive, Cambridge, and Soldiers Field Road, Brighton. The Commission V O T E D to invite the Committee to use Hell's Half Acre on May 24, 1970 and June 14, 1970 on a trial basis, and to suggest that the Committee visit the Breakheart Reservation and the MEBAC area as soon as possible, and report to the Commission as to the suitability of these sites.
 - 2 Matter of reimbursing Lagoon Concessionaires for certain electrical work performed for them by Boston Edison Company in 1969, without Commission knowledge. The Commission V O T E D: Denied.
 - 3 Request of Mayor James R. McIntyre, City of Quincy, March 27, for use of a part of Quincy Shore Drive, from Hancock Street to East Squantum Street, for trucking to Jordan Marsh construction site. The Commission V O T E D: Permission denied because of questionable safety of Atlantic Bridge for heavy trucking.

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RESOLUTION

It is with deep regret that the members of the Metropolitan District Commission are moved to record the death of Mr. Frederick W. Gow, former Chief Engineer of the Metropolitan District Commission's Construction Division, on July 28, 1970.

He first began his employment with the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Metropolitan District Water Supply Commission in 1926, and served said Commission and its successor, the Metropolitan District Commission, until his retirement on September 30, 1967.

WHEREAS: Mr. Gow rendered notable service during his long years of employment with the Commission, and his high conception of his duties and responsibilities as a public servant immeasurably advanced the Commission's usefulness, and redounded greatly to its credit. The affairs of the Commission claimed his interest at all times. As Chief Engineer, he contributed in large measure to many M.D.C. projects of vital importance, and earned the respect of all who knew him.

While "Fred" Gow lived with zest and purpose, he was infinitely patient, kindly, and understanding. He was a good friend. He loved good music, good talk, and was a most companionable man. He was a devoted husband, and found great comfort in a happy home life.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the members of the Metropolitan District Commission record their great sense of loss in the passing of their esteemed former Chief Engineer, Mr. Frederick W. Gow, and their grateful remembrance of his service to this Commission, and that this Resolution be spread upon the records of the Commission, and sent to his beloved wife, Mrs. Hazel Curnane Gow.

- B. After high school hockey starts:
Same - except that two days a week at each rink (2:00 to midnight) will be available for rentals to schools and adult groups. In addition to hockey days, either Mondays or Tuesdays (5:00 to midnight) will be available for rentals in those rinks where attendance is low.

- C. At the close of the high school hockey season:
Same schedule as Item A.

4. RENTAL RATES:

- A. \$20.00 per hour for all schools and organizations.
- B. \$30.00 per hour for a scrimmage game.
- C. Except for school teams a minimum of 25 players is required for rental.

5. GENERAL:

- A. During school vacation periods hockey practice will be held from 7:00 A.M. to 1:00 P.M. on the regularly assigned days so that the rink will be available for general skating afternoons and evenings.
- B. Whenever possible the rinks will be rented before 9:00 AM on school days and from 10:00 P.M. to 12:10 A.M. on general skating session days. (This may necessitate the payment of the two hours overtime).
- C. Minimum Age - Evenings:
Sixteen unless accompanied by an adult. This regulation is not in effect when there is no school the day following.
- D. No high school hockey on holidays.
- E. Rinks will be closed Christmas Eve and Christmas day, New Year's Eve.
- F. Average Weekly hours:

Item A.
General skating - 57 Rentals - 38

Item B.
General skating - 51 Rentals - 44

Using one additional evening session in ten rinks would provide 60 more hours of rental.





COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS
METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION
Rules and Regulations for the
Government and Use of the Reservations and Parkways
Under the Care and Control
of the Metropolitan District Commission

Promulgated Under the Authority of General Laws, Chapter 92, Section
37 as Amended

(Reservations and Parkways shall include all boulevards, roadways, driveways, bridges, buildings, structures, land, beaches, ponds, lakes, rivers and other waters under the care and control of the Metropolitan District Commission.)

1. Entrance on and exit from reservations or parkways by vehicular traffic shall be made over designated areas only.
2. No person is allowed on M.D.C. property except during specified hours unless authorized by a written permit from the Commission.
3. Swimming, fishing, ball playing, skating, skiing and other sporting activities shall be allowed only at such times and in such areas as are designed, set aside, or otherwise designated therefor. Swimmers must be properly attired.
4. Cookouts shall be allowed only in places designated therefor; and the use of fires, grilles, hibachis and other apparatus for cooking is permitted subject to the direction of any M.D.C. Police Officer. Picnics are allowed except in those areas where expressly prohibited.

5. Drunkenness, breach of the peace, profanity or other disorderly conduct offensive to the general public are strictly forbidden.
6. No person shall willfully obstruct the free passage of vehicles or persons; or spit upon any sidewalk or path within any reservation or parkway.
7. No person shall cause or permit any animal owned by him or in his custody or under his control, except a dog when restrained by a leash not exceeding seven feet in length, to roam or be at large in, on, or through any reservation or parkway, or to be hitched or tied to a fence, tree, bush, shrub, or any object or structure except as provided therefor; nor ride or drive a horse or animal not well broken and under proper control and then only on such roadways or bridle paths where authorized; nor neglect or refuse to stop, place, change, or move the position of said horse or animal as directed by a Police Officer.
8. The use of bicycles, skimobiles, and other means of transportation shall be permitted only in areas set aside or authorized for such use.
9. No person, except in an emergency, shall bring, land, or cause to descend within any reservation or parkway any airplane, parachute or other apparatus of aviation, except by written permit from the Commission.
10. No person shall injure, deface, destroy, remove or carry off any sign, structure, facility, tree or any other property or equipment, real or personal, under the care and control of the Metropolitan District Commission.
11. Parades, games, fairs, carnivals, bazaars, gifts or solicitations for raising or collecting funds shall not be permitted without written Commission approval.
12. Lotteries, raffles, gambling and games of chance are prohibited; and no person shall have possession of machinery, instruments or equipment of any kind for use in same on M.D.C. property.
13. Public assemblies of more than twenty-five (25) persons shall not be allowed without a written permit from the Commission.
14. No person shall engage in any business, sale, or display of goods or wares without a written permit from the Commission.
15. Commercial signs and advertising are prohibited on M.D.C. property; other signs, notices, advertisements or leaflets of any kind may be displayed, but shall not be distributed or affixed without a written permit from the Commission.
16. No person, unless authorized by law or permit, shall have possession of or discharge any weapon, firearm, fireworks or other explosive.
17. Hunting or trapping of animals or birds shall not be permitted unless specifically authorized by the Commission. Injuring or otherwise disturbing animals or birds is prohibited.
18. No person shall drop, throw, or place and allow to remain any litter, garbage, or other refuse, except in the receptacles provided therefor; nor throw a lighted match or any other burning substance in said receptacles; nor bring or cause to be brought within any reservation or parkway any garbage, refuse or material for the purpose of dumping, or depositing same within said receptacles.
19. No person shall drop, throw or place any litter, garbage or refuse in any of the rivers or waters under the care and control of the Commission, or in any other way pollute or contribute to the pollution of such rivers or waters.
20. No person shall refuse or neglect to obey any posted regulatory sign or the lawful directions of a Police Officer or person in charge.

Whoever throws or places, or causes to be thrown or placed, any trash or other debris on any parkway, lake, stream or river or within twenty (20) yards of such parkway, lake, stream or river shall be punished by a fine of not more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00). (Acts of 1970, Chapter 134)

Any other violation of these rules shall be punishable with a fine of not more than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00). (Acts of 1970, Chapter 489)

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Covering Discharge of

Sewage, Drainage, Substances or Wastes

Under the authority of Chapter 92 of the General Laws (Sections 2, 3, 9, 102), and under the authority and in compliance with the directive contained in Section 12 of Chapter 705 of the Acts of 1945, the Metropolitan District Commission has established the following rules and regulations covering the discharge of sewage, drainage, substances or wastes into any sewer under its control, or any sewer tributary thereto.

ARTICLE I
DEFINITIONS

Unless the context specifically indicates otherwise, the meaning of terms used in these rules and regulations shall be as follows:

1. "BOD" (denoting Biochemical Oxygen Demand) shall mean the quantity of oxygen utilized in the biochemical oxidation of organic matter under standard laboratory procedure in five (5) days at 20°C, expressed in milligrams per liter.
2. "Building Sewer" shall mean the connection from a building to the municipal or Commission sewer.
3. "Combined Sewer" shall mean a sewer receiving both surface runoff and sewage.
4. "Commission" shall mean the Metropolitan District Commission of Massachusetts, or any other commission, board or officers duly authorized to act for the Commonwealth in the application of these rules and regulations.
5. "Garbage" shall mean solid wastes from the domestic and commercial preparation, cooking, and dispensing of food, and from the handling, storage, and sale of produce.
6. "Garage" shall mean any building wherein is kept or stored one or more motor vehicles, including among others a public or private garage, carport, motor vehicle repair shop or paint shop, service station, lubritorium, car wash, or any building used for similar purposes.
7. "Industrial Wastes" shall mean the liquid wastes from industrial manufacturing processes, trade, or business as distinct from sanitary sewage.
8. "Municipality" shall mean any city or town that discharges sewage into the Metropolitan Sewerage system whether the city or town is a member of the Metropolitan Sewerage District by legislative action or is served by contract with the Metropolitan District Commission.
9. "Person" shall mean any individual, firm, company, association, society, corporation, or group.
10. "pH" shall mean the logarithm of the reciprocal of the weight of hydrogen ions in grams per liter of solution.
11. "Property Shredded Garbage" shall mean the wastes from the preparation, cooking, and dispensing of food that have been shredded to such a degree that all particles will be carried freely under the flow conditions normally prevailing in public sewers, with no particle greater than one-half (1/2) inch (1.27 centimeters) in any dimension.
12. "Public Sewer" shall mean a sewer in which all owners of abutting properties have equal rights, and is controlled by public authority.
13. "Sanitary Sewer" shall mean a sewer which carries sewage and to which storm, surface, and groundwaters are not intentionally admitted.
14. "Sewage" shall mean a combination of the water-carried wastes from residences, business buildings, institutions, and industrial establishments, together with such ground, surface, and stormwaters as may be present.
15. "Sewage Treatment Plant" shall mean any arrangement of devices and structures used for treating sewage.
16. "Sewer" shall mean a pipe or conduit for carrying sewage.
17. "Sewerage Works" shall mean all facilities for collecting, pumping, treating, and disposing of sewage.
18. "Shall" is mandatory; "May" is permissive.
19. "Slug" shall mean any discharge of water, sewage, or industrial waste which in concentration of any given constituent or in quantity of flow exceeds for any period of duration longer than fifteen (15) minutes more than five (5) times the average twenty-four (24) hour concentration or flows during normal operation.
20. "Storm Drain" (sometimes termed "storm sewer") shall mean a sewer which carries storm and surface waters and drainage, but excludes sewage and industrial wastes, other than unpolluted water.
21. "Suspended Solids" shall mean solids that either float on the surface of, or are in suspension in water, sewage, or other liquids, and which are removable by laboratory filtering.

ARTICLE II

USE OF METROPOLITAN SEWERAGE SYSTEM

1. All municipalities which connect their public sewers with the

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Metropolitan sewers shall do so subject to the direction, control and regulation of the Commission, and any person may, subject to regulations of the Commission and to such terms, conditions and regulations as each municipality may prescribe, connect building sewers with such sewers. All new systems of sewers and extensions of existing systems shall be constructed so as to separate storm water from ordinary sewage. G.L. Chap. 92, Sect.2.

2. The plumbing of any estate or premises shall be so arranged as to keep such waters as described in 3 (a) separate from the sewage and connections shall be made which will conduct the waters to a drain or watercourse and the sewage to the public sewer; but where only one conduit shall have been provided by the municipality, such connections shall be constructed into the street and connected to the conduit so provided, and the municipality shall provide the other conduit and all necessary connections with either conduit. G.L. Chap.92, Sect.9.
3. No municipality shall discharge or cause to be discharged or allow to be discharged into any Metropolitan sewer or any sewer tributary thereto any of the following described waters or wastes.
 - (a) Any stormwater, surface water, roof runoff, tidewater, river water, ground water, subsurface drainage, uncontaminated cooling water, or unpolluted industrial process waters.
 - (b) Any gasoline, benzene, naphtha, fuel oil, crude petroleum, or any other of its products, or any other flammable or explosive liquid, solid, or gas.
 - (c) Any waters or wastes containing toxic or poisonous solids, liquids or gases in sufficient quantity, either singly or by interaction with other wastes, to injure or interfere with any sewage treatment process, constitute a hazard to humans or animals, create a public nuisance, or create any hazard in the receiving waters of the sewage treatment plants.
 - (d) Any waters or wastes having a pH higher than 9.5 or lower than 5.5, or having any other corrosive property capable of causing damage or hazard to structures, equipment, and personnel of the sewerage works.
 - (e) Any solid or viscous substances in quantities or of such size as to be capable of causing obstruction to the flow in sewers, or other interference with the proper operation of the sewerage works; such as, but not limited to, ashes, cinders, sand, mud, straw, shavings, metal, glass, rags, feathers, tar, plastics, wood, unground garbage, whole blood, paunch manure, hair and fleshings, entrails, paper dishes, cups, milk containers, etc., either whole or ground by garbage grinders.
4. No municipality shall discharge or cause to be discharged or allow to be discharged into any Metropolitan sewer or any sewer tributary thereto any of the following described substances, materials, waters, or wastes if it appears likely in the opinion of the Commission that such wastes can harm either the sewers, sewage treatment process, or equipment, have an adverse effect on the receiving waters, or can otherwise endanger life, limb, public property, or constitute a nuisance. In forming its opinion as to the acceptability of these wastes, the Commission will give consideration to such factors as the quantities of subject wastes in relation to flows and velocities in the sewers, materials of construction of the sewers, nature of the sewage treatment process, capacity of the sewage treatment plant, degree of treatability of wastes in the sewage treatment plant, and other pertinent factors. The substances prohibited are:
 - (a) Any liquid or vapor having a temperature higher than one hundred fifty (150)^oF (65^oC).
 - (b) Any water or waste containing fats, wax, grease, or oils, whether emulsified or not, in excess of one hundred (100) mg/l or containing substances which may solidify or become viscous at temperatures between thirty-two (32)^o and one hundred fifty (150)^oF (0^o and 65^oC).
 - (c) Any garbage that has not been properly shredded.
 - (d) Any waters or wastes containing strong acid iron pickling wastes, or concentrated plating solutions whether neutralized or not.
 - (e) Any waters or wastes containing iron, nickel, chromium, copper, cyanide, zinc, and similar objectionable or toxic

- substances; or wastes exerting excessive chlorine requirement, to such degree that any such material received exceeds the limits established by the Commission for such materials.
- (f) Any waters or wastes containing phenols or other taste-producing or odor-producing substances, in concentrations which exceed limits which may be established by the Commission as necessary to meet the requirements of the State or Federal agencies of jurisdiction for such discharge to the receiving waters.
- (g) Any radioactive wastes or isotopes of such half-life or concentration as may exceed limits established by the Commission in compliance with State or Federal regulations.
- (h) Any material which exerts or causes:
- (1) Unusual concentrations of inert suspended solids (such as, but not limited to, Fuller's earth, lime slurries, and lime residues) or of dissolved solids (such as, but not limited to, sodium chloride and sodium sulfate).
 - (2) Excessive discoloration (such as, but not limited to, dye wastes and vegetable tanning solutions).
 - (3) Unusual BOD, chemical oxygen demand, or chlorine requirements in such quantities as to constitute a significant load on the sewage treatment works.
 - (4) Unusual volume of flow or concentration of wastes constituting "slugs" as defined herein.
- (i) Any waters or wastes containing substances which are not amenable to treatment or reduction by the sewage treatment processes employed, or are amenable to treatment only to such degree that the sewage treatment plan effluent cannot meet the requirements of other public agencies having jurisdiction over discharge into the receiving waters.
5. No municipality shall discharge or cause to be discharged or allow to be discharged into any Metropolitan sewer or any sewer tributary thereto any septic tank or cesspool cleanings or any sewage or industrial wastes which originate in any territory outside the limits of the Metropolitan Sewerage District.
6. Garages and other establishments where gasoline is used or where wastes containing grease in excessive amounts or any flammable wastes, sand, or other harmful ingredients can be discharged and are connected with public sewers, shall be provided with a suitable trap or separator. All traps or separators shall be of a type and capacity approved by the Commission and shall be located so as to be readily and easily accessible for cleaning and inspection.
7. Where preliminary treatment or flow-equalizing facilities, or traps or separators are provided for any waters or wastes, they shall be maintained continuously in satisfactory and effective operation by the owner at his expense.
8. When required by the Commission, the owner of any property serviced by a building sewer carrying industrial wastes shall install a suitable control or measuring device together with such necessary manholes, chambers, meters and other appurtenances in the building sewer to facilitate observation, sampling, and measurement of the wastes, such manhole or chamber, when required, shall be accessibly and safely located and shall be constructed in accordance with plans approved by the Commission. The manhole, chamber, meters, etc., shall be installed by the owner at his expense, and shall be maintained by him so as to be safe and accessible and in good operating condition at all times. The records from the meters and measuring devices shall be furnished to the Commission upon request therefor.
9. All measurements, tests, and analyses of the characteristics of waters and wastes to which reference is made in these rules and regulations shall be determined in accordance with the latest edition of "Standard Methods for the Examination of Water and Wastewater," published by the American Public Health Association, and shall be determined at the control manhole or chamber provided, or by use of suitable samples taken at the control manhole or chamber. In the event that no special manhole or chamber has been provided, the control point shall be considered to be the nearest downstream manhole in the public sewer to the point at which the building sewer is connected. Sampling shall be carried out by customarily accepted methods to reflect the effect of constituents upon the sewerage works

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and to determine the existence of hazards to health and property. The particular analyses involved will determine whether a twenty-four (24) hour composite of all effluents of the premises is appropriate or whether a grab sample or samples should be taken. BOD and suspended solids analyses shall normally be obtained from 24 hr. composites of all effluents whereas pH's shall normally be determined from periodic grab samples.

10. Failure on the part of any municipality to comply with any rule or regulation contained herein, or with any order made under the authority thereof, lawfully affecting such municipality, shall be sufficient cause for the levying and collecting by the Commission from such municipality of such additional assessment or assessments as the Commission may deem necessary to compensate it for the disposal of sewage, drainage, substances or wastes from such municipality; provided, that no such additional assessment shall be levied on any such municipality in any one year which shall exceed the lesser of an amount equal to one twentieth of one per cent of the taxable value of such municipality, or the sum of two hundred thousand dollars.

Ch.705, Acts 1945

11. No statement contained in this article shall be construed as preventing any special agreement or arrangement between the Commission and any municipality whereby an industrial waste of unusual strength or character may be accepted by the Commission.

- 7 Contract No. 2070-I, dated April 7, 1971, with J. J. Reddington Electric Service Co., for electrical repairs of heating cable in Storrow Drive Tunnel and Berkeley Street Underpass, Charles River Lower Division.

The Secretary submitted for signature the following paper, which was signed by the Commissioner and three Associate Commissioners:

- 8 Agreement with Eastern Parking, Inc., dated April 7, 1971, for consultant services covering the operation of parking facilities at M.D.C. recreational areas.

- 9 A hearing was given to a representative of the Boston Edison Company on its petition for grant of location for three (3) manholes, three (3) test stations and steel pipes, with the necessary wires, cables and related apparatus therein, in William J. Day Boulevard, Boston (South Boston District), Mount Vernon Street and William T. Morrissey Boulevard, Boston (Dorchester District).
 ORDERED that, on petition of Boston Edison Company dated March 10,

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1971, for locations shown on plans of Boston Edison Company dated September 9, 1970, and indexed accession numbers 46802X through 46806X, inclusive, for three (3) manholes, three (3) test stations and steel pipes, with the necessary wires, cables and related apparatus therein, to be used for the transmission of electricity, in William J. Day Boulevard, Boston (South Boston District), Mount Vernon Street, Boston (Dorchester District), and William T. Morrissey Boulevard, Boston (Dorchester District), a distance of approximately 5180 feet, said location being under the care and control of this Commission, and found by order of the Department of Public Utilities to be required by public convenience and necessity, said plans and petition being on file in the office of the Commission, a hearing on said petition having been given by this Commission on Thursday, April 7, 1971, at 9:55 A.M., at the office of the Commission in Boston, of which hearing due notice was given to all persons interested of the time and place by publishing a copy of said petition and the order of notice issued thereon by this Commission in newspapers published in the City of Boston, being the city in which the location petitioned for would lie, the first publication having been made at least fourteen days prior to the date of said hearing, and it appearing, in the opinion of this Commission, that public convenience and necessity so require, said Boston Edison Company is hereby granted a location for said manholes, test stations and steel pipes, with the necessary wires, cables and related apparatus therein, in said William J. Day Boulevard, Mount Vernon Street, and William T. Morrissey Boulevard, to the extent and upon the terms, conditions and obligations hereinafter specified, the same being such as the public necessity and a due regard for the rights of the Commonwealth require, namely:-

1. The Boston Edison Company shall conform to all provisions of law applicable to the exercise of the rights and performance of the work under this grant and to the rules and regulations of the Metropolitan District Commission.
2. The Boston Edison Company shall do the work of installing said manholes, test stations and steel pipes, with the necessary wires, cables and related apparatus therein, in the location hereby granted subject to the approval of the Director of Park Engineering of the Commission as to time, manner and location and in all other respects.
3. Said Boston Edison Company shall indemnify and save harmless the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the Metropolitan District Commission from any damage it or they may sustain or be required to pay arising out of the exercise by said Company or any of its employees in connection with the work done hereunder.
4. Said Boston Edison Company shall protect and maintain all trees, drainage or water pipes, and all appurtenances or structures either above or below the surface of the ground over which this location lies, and upon completion of the work shall restore the surface of the ground to the condition in which it was at the time of this grant and in a manner satisfactory to said Director of Park Engineering of the Commission, and shall maintain the surface of the ground and the location throughout in such condition to the satisfaction of said Director.
5. The Boston Edison Company shall place and maintain proper barriers at all times and from the beginning of twilight through the whole of every night sufficient lights to protect the public from injury or damage during the progress of the work under this grant or during repairs upon said manholes, test stations and steel pipes, with the necessary wires, cables and related apparatus therein, and work on the location which may hereafter become necessary.
6. No work shall be done under this grant without first obtaining a permit therefor from said Director of Park Engineering and subject to conditions imposed by him.

1 A conference was held with Wilfred A. Nolan, Elementary Coordinator, Quincy Public Schools, in regard to Senate Bill No. 1233, An Act Providing That Certain Land Under the Control and Jurisdiction of the Metropolitan District Commission Be Considered as Part of the Furnace Brook School Site, in Order to Qualify for State Financial Assistance under the School Buildings Assistance Act. With Mr. Nolan were Mr. John A. Calabro, S.B.A.B., Commonwealth of Massachusetts, and representatives of Quincy Public Schools (names in file). After a long discussion relative to the Quincy problem, it was finally left that Mr. John J. Grigalus, Director of the M.D.C. Right-of-Way Section, would prepare the papers necessary for the transfer of care and control of the land in question, and that the Commissioner would be in touch with the group shortly thereafter.

Present, Commissioner Sears and Associate Commissioners Haggerty, O'Brien, Rosenblatt and Lyman, Jr.

The records of the preceding meeting were read and approved.



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

The records of the preceding meeting were read and approved, as corrected.



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


