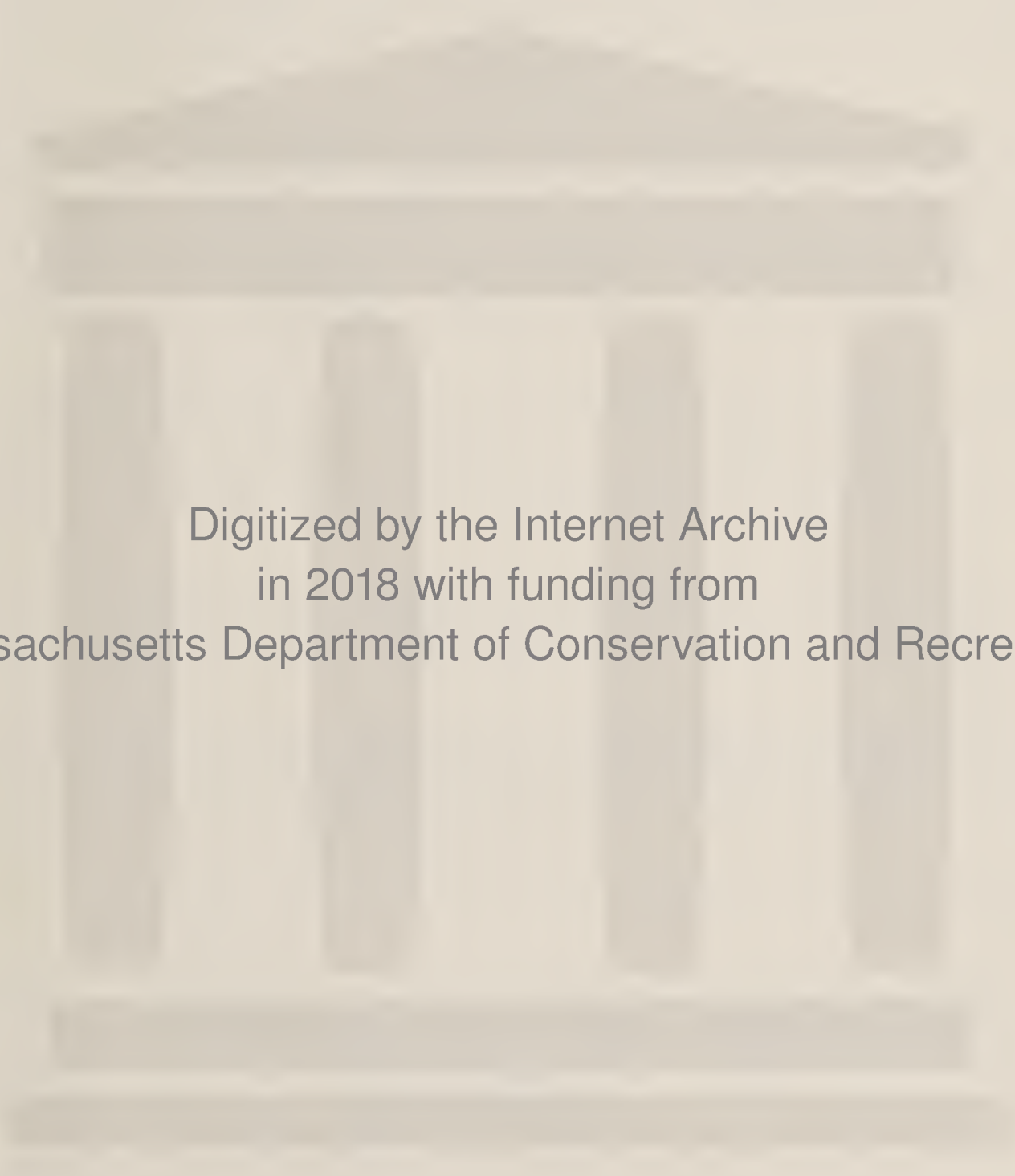

Record of the Two Thousand Two Hundred and Twenty-fifth (2225th) Meeting of the Metropolitan District Commission, duly called and held at 20 Somerset Street, Boston, Massachusetts, on Thursday, February 1, 1962, at 10:00 A.M.

Present, Commissioner Murphy and Associate Commissioners Cook, Greenough, Haggerty and O'Brien.

The records of the preceding meeting were read and approved.

- 1 The Secretary submitted for signature an Agreement for engineering services in connection with electric utilities, installations and rates, with James S. Minges of Farmington, Connecticut, d/b/a James S. Minges and Associates. The Commission V O T E D: Held over.

The Secretary submitted for signature the following papers which were signed by a majority of the Commission:

- 2 Contract number 1291, dated February 1, 1962, with Waghorne Brown Company, for designing, furnishing and installing a portable protective aluminum frame and covering for the Edward Hatch Memorial Music Shell, Embankment Road, Charles River Reservation, Boston.

3 AGREEMENT

VOTED: To authorize the use by The Boston Edison Company of one three (3) inch Street Light Conduit about three hundred twenty-five (325) feet in length located on the Arborway between Shea Circle and Washington Street, Jamaica Plain, Massachusetts, shown on a plan entitled "M.D.C. Controlled, Boston Edison Company, Engineering and Construction Department, \* \* \* Dated: January 22, 1962, Plan Order No. C-6, F. M. Staszsky, Superintendent, by T. E. Rollins," and to execute an agreement accordingly.

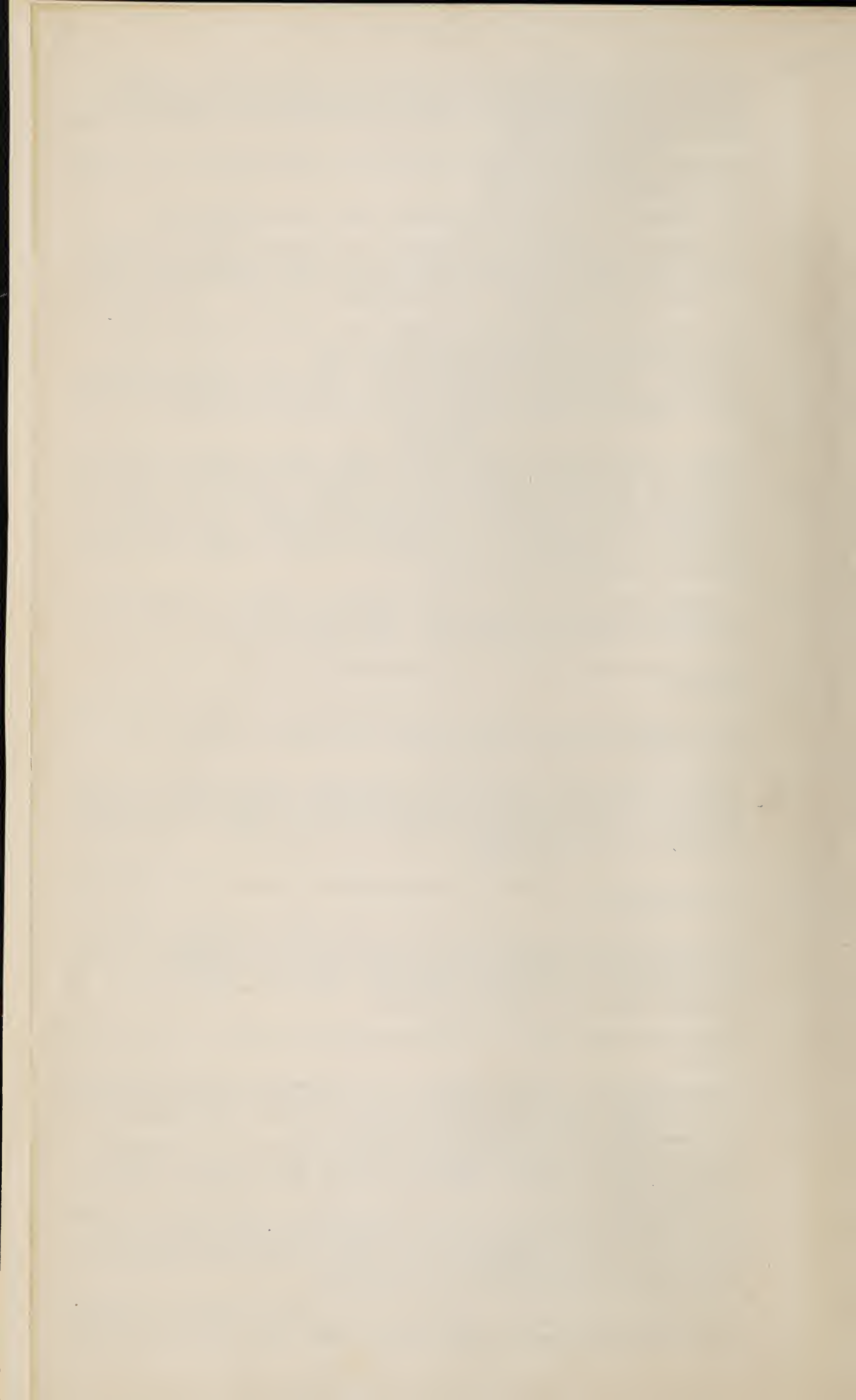

- 7 Report, January 31, on bids for the construction of Section One of the South Charles Relief Sewer of the Metropolitan Sewerage District in the Cities of Boston and Cambridge - Contract No. C-200. The Commission V O T E D to accept the lowest bid, that of The Barletta Co., Inc., of \$2,508,706.50.

Martin and Fink, for the remodeling of the Head House Concession Building, in accordance with Mr. Martin's recommendation. The Commission further V O T E D to authorize a solicitation of bids for the Head House Concession for a five-year period, with the understanding that a remodeling of the Head House in accordance with the plans and specifications to be prepared, shall be included as a requirement in the proposal to be submitted.

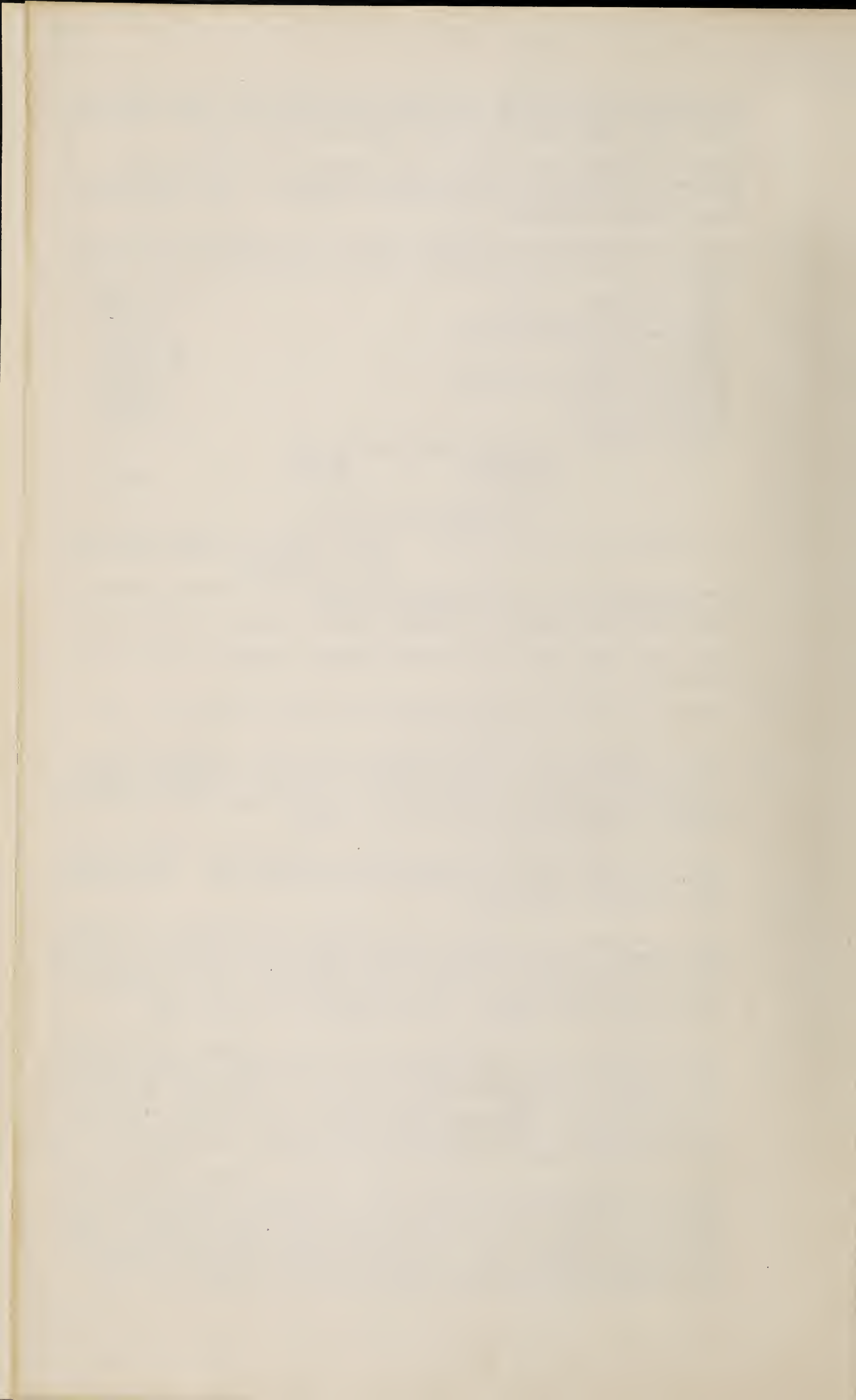

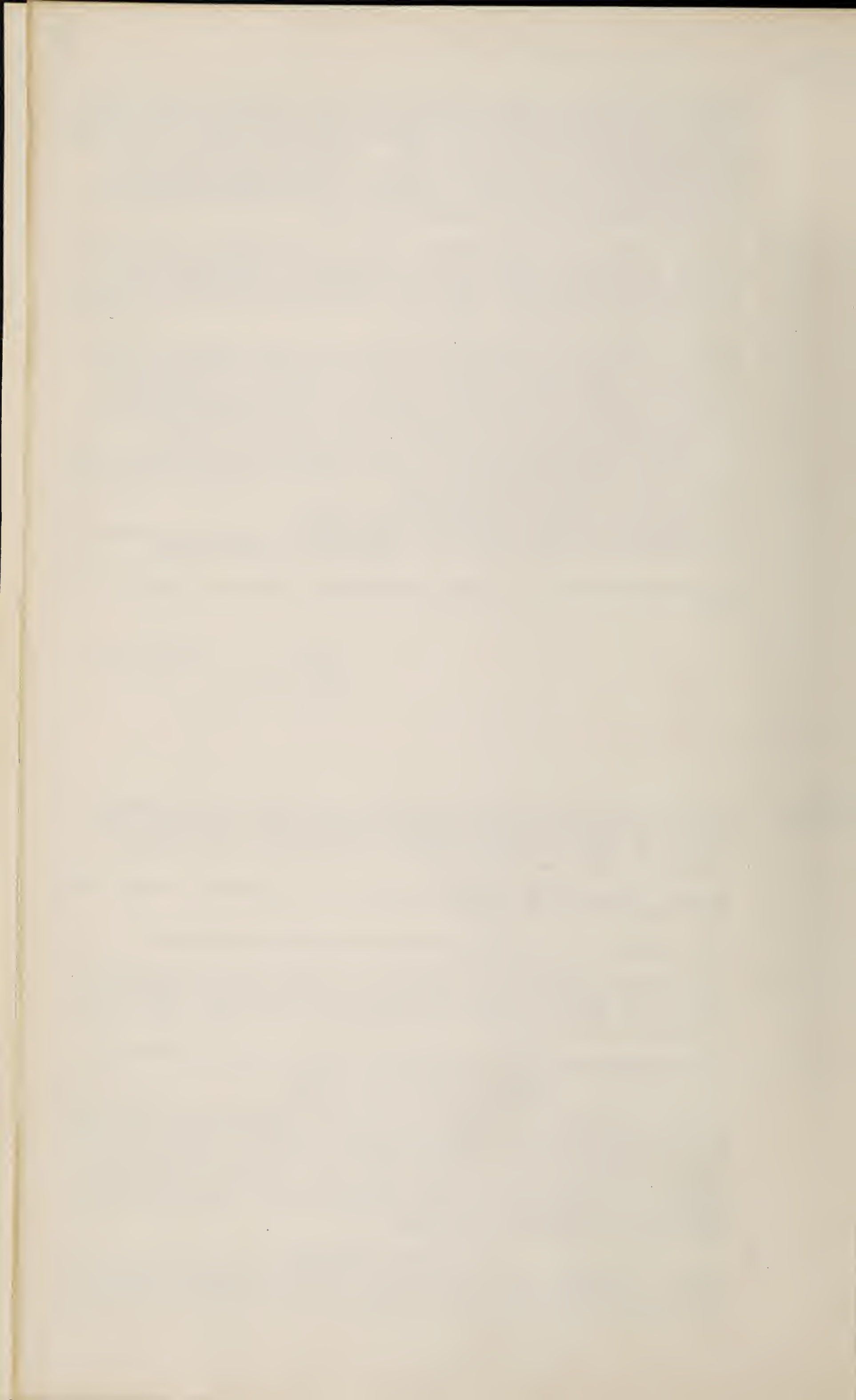

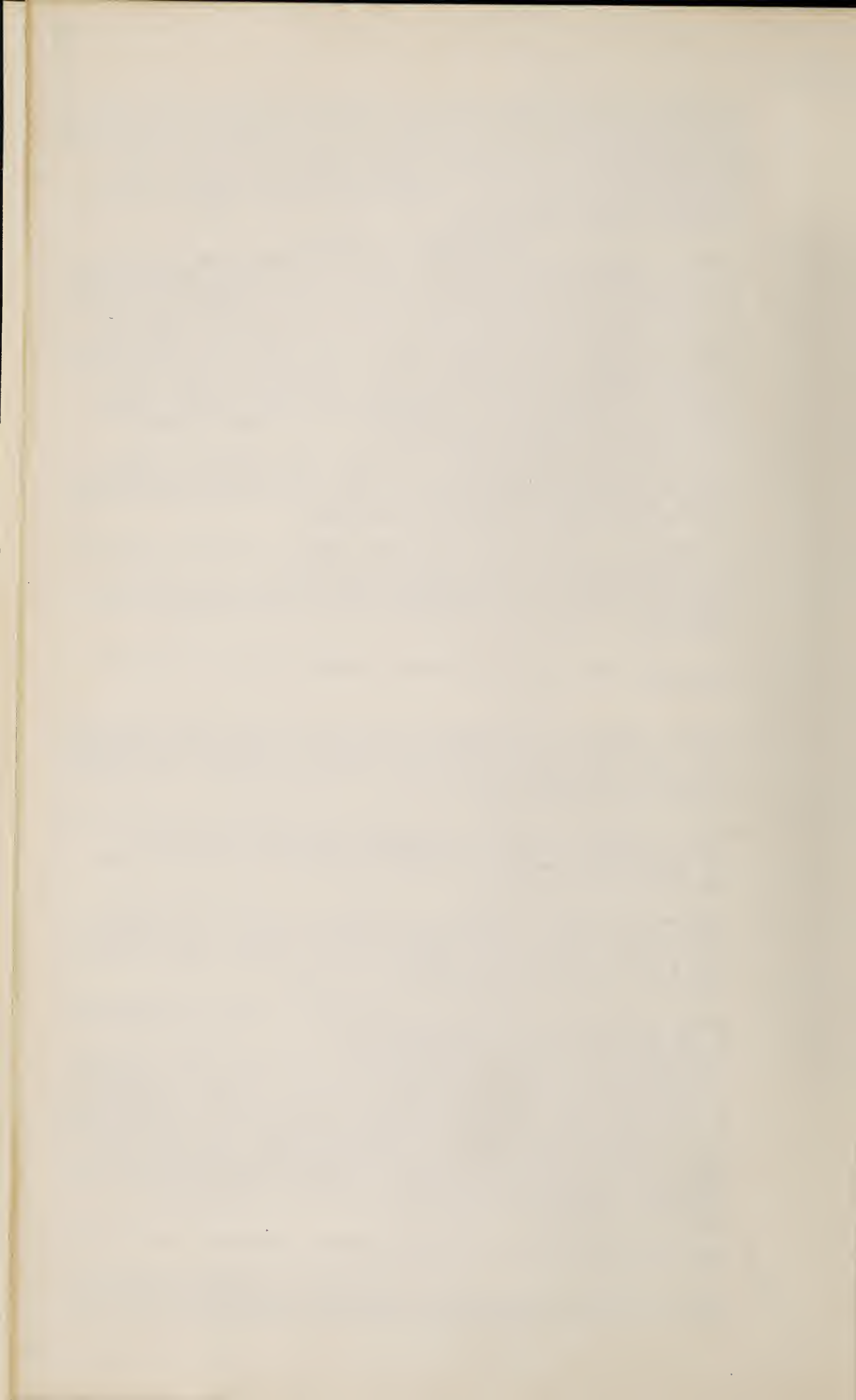

The Commission V O T E D to refer this matter to the Attorney General for his immediate action, as recommended by Mr. Toole.

7 Report, February 7, relative to permitting the Town of Hubbardston to use land owned by the Commission adjacent to Asneconick Pond in Hubbardston for recreational purposes.  
The Commission V O T E D to authorize Mr. Toole to notify the Town of Hubbardston Recreation Committee that the Commission is willing to grant the Town a revocable permit granting the Town permission to use land of the Commission adjacent to Asneconick Pond in Hubbardston for the establishment of a bathing beach and for other recreational purposes under terms and conditions which would meet with the approval of the State Department of Public Health and protect the Commission's interests; Mr. Toole to work out details with the Town Officials, the Town of Hubbardston to pay the cost involved in preparing the agreement.

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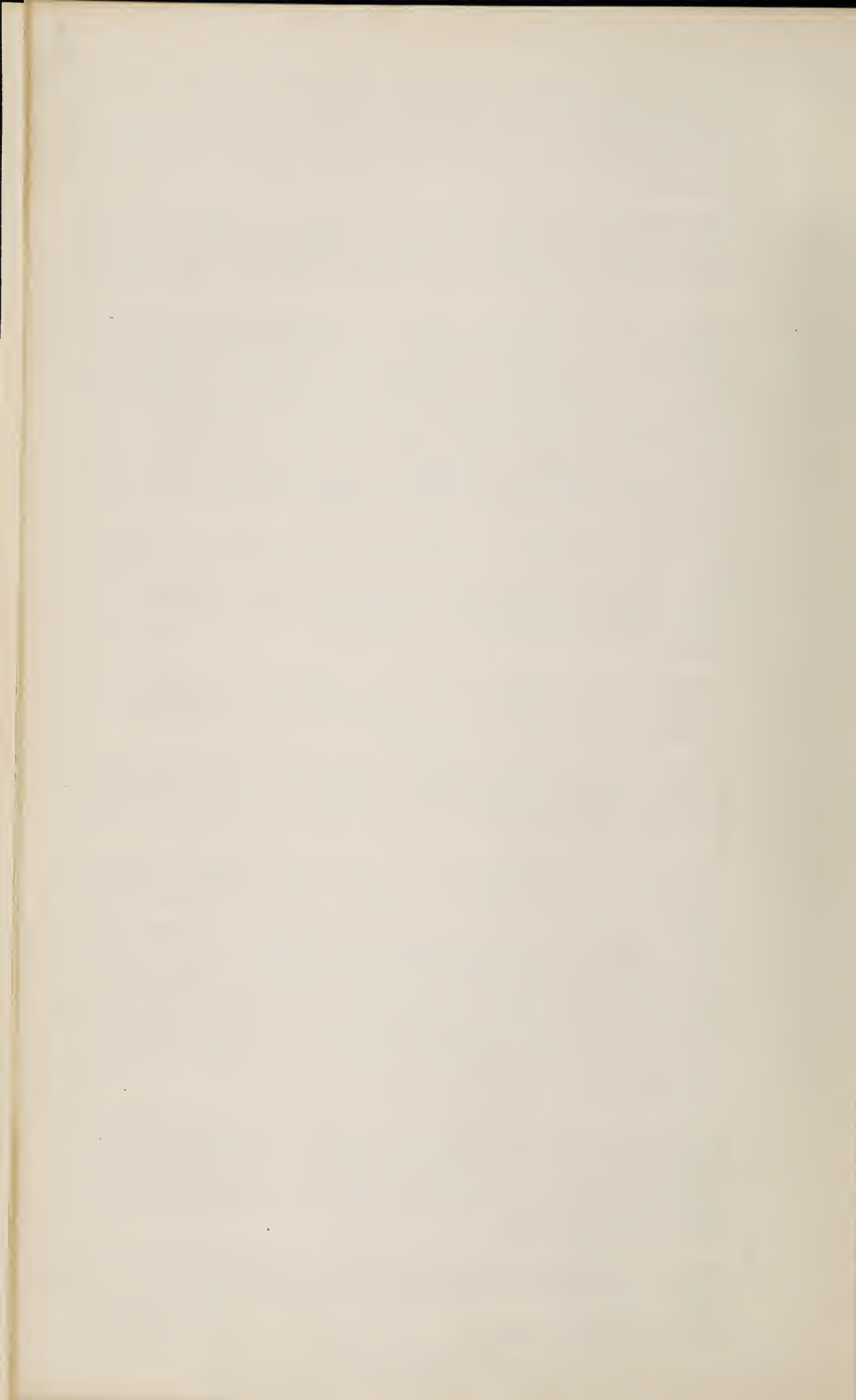

The Commission V O T E D to accept the lowest bid, that of Malan Construction Corporation, including Alternate 5B, of \$5,521,175.00.

Action was taken upon the following matters relating to the Parks Division:

- 1 Memorandum of Mr. Barry, January 30, on request of Ethel M. Pinkson for a 5-year extension of her lease of land, with building thereon, at corner of Wharf Avenue and George Washington Boulevard, Nantasket Beach Reservation, for the sum of \$250.00 per year. The Commission V O T E D: Held over.
- 2 Letter of Walter D. Stone, January 30, requesting authority to attend (1) a meeting of the American Institute of Park Executives in Wheeling, West Virginia, from February 24 through February 26, and (2) a meeting of the American Association of Zoological Parks and Aquariums in Birmingham, Alabama, from February 27 through March 2; also requesting authorization to negotiate for the purchase of various animals and birds in a sum not to exceed \$20,000.00. The Commission V O T E D to approve Mr. Stone's attendance at the meetings in Wheeling, West Virginia, and Birmingham, Alabama, subject to the approval of the Commission on Administration and Finance. Mr. Cook then moved that Mr. Stone be authorized to negotiate for the purchase of various animals and birds in a sum not to exceed \$10,000.00. ORDERED that the Metropolitan District Commission, acting herein by virtue of the authority conferred upon the Metropolitan District Water Supply Commission, by Chapter 705 of the Acts of the year 1945 and acts in amendment thereof or in addition thereto, which authority was vested in the Metropolitan District Commission by Chapter 583 of the Acts of 1947 and every other power and authority hereto enabling, does hereby order the taking of and does hereby take under the provisions of Chapter 79 of the General Laws, in the name and for the benefit of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, the perpetual right and easement to construct, inspect, repair, renew, replace, operate and maintain a covered sewer, connecting sewers and drains, with their proper manholes, embankments, walls, culverts and other appurtenances in, through and under the following described parcel of land situated in the city of Boston in the County of Suffolk and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, shown on plan entitled "Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Metr. 2. The Boston Edison Company shall do the work of installing said vault, manhole, transformers, conduits, wires and cables, in the location hereby granted subject to the approval of the Director of Park Engineering of the Commission as to time, manner and location and in all other respects.
3. Said Boston Edison Company shall indemnify and save harmless the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the Metropolitan District Commission from any damage it or they may sustain or be required to pay arising out of the exercise by said Company of the rights hereby granted or by reason of any negligence of said Company or any of its employees in connection with the work done hereunder.
4. Said Boston Edison Company shall protect and maintain all trees, drainage or water pipes, and all appurtenances or structures either above or below the surface of the ground over which this location lies, and upon completion of the work shall restore the surface of the ground to the condition in which it was at the time of this grant and in a manner satisfactory to said Director of Park Engineering of the Commission, and shall maintain the surface of the ground and the location throughout in such condition to the satisfaction of said Director.
5. The Boston Edison Company shall place and maintain proper barriers at all times and from the beginning of twilight through the whole of every night sufficient lights to protect the public from injury or damage during the progress of the work under this grant or during repairs upon said vault, manhole, transformers, conduits, wires and cables, and work on the location which may hereafter become necessary.
6. No work shall be done under this grant without first obtaining a permit therefor from said Director of Park Engineering and subject to conditions imposed by him.

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A hearing was given to a representative of the Boston Edison Company on its petition for grant of location for conduit, wires and cables in Arborway, Boston (West Roxbury District).

ORDERED that, on petition of Boston Edison Company dated April 18, 1962, for location shown on plan of Boston Edison Company dated January 31, 1962, and indexed accession number 40391X, for conduit, wires and cables, for the distribution of electricity, in Arborway, northwesterly from Forest Hills Street, a distance of about 115 feet; Arborway, northwesterly from a point approximately 410 feet northwest of Forest Hills Street, a distance of about 25 feet, in the City of Boston (West Roxbury District), said Arborway being a boulevard under the care and control of this Commission, said location having been found by order of the Department of Public Utilities to be required by public convenience and necessity, said plan and petition being on file in the office of this Commission, a hearing on said petition having been given by this Commission on Thursday, May 10, 1962, at 3:00 P.M., at the office of the Commission in Boston, of which hearing due notice was given to all persons interested of the time and place by publishing a copy of said petition and the order of notice issued thereon by this Commission in a newspaper published in the City of Boston, being the city in which the location petitioned for would lie, the first publication having been made at least fourteen days prior to the date of said hearing, and it appearing, in the opinion of this Commission that public convenience and necessity so require, said Boston Edison Company is hereby granted a location for said conduit, wires and cables, in said Arborway, to the extent and upon the terms, conditions and obligations hereinafter specified, the same being such as the public necessity and a due regard for the rights of the Commonwealth require, namely:-

1. The Boston Edison Company shall conform to all provisions of law applicable to the exercise of the rights and performance of the work under this grant and to the rules and regulations of the Metropolitan District Commission.
2. The Boston Edison Company shall do the work of installing said conduit, wires and cables, in the location hereby granted subject to the approval of the Director of Park Engineering of the Commission as to time, manner and location and in all other respects.
3. Said Boston Edison Company shall indemnify and save harmless the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the Metropolitan District Commis-



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sion from any damage it or they may sustain or be required to pay arising out of the exercise by said Company of the rights hereby granted or by reason of any negligence of said Company or any of its employees in connection with the work done hereunder.

4. Said Boston Edison Company shall protect and maintain all trees, drainage or water pipes, and all appurtenances or structures either above or below the surface of the ground over which this location lies, and upon completion of the work shall restore the surface of the ground to the condition in which it was at the time of this grant and in a manner satisfactory to said Director of Park Engineering of the Commission, and shall maintain the surface of the ground and the location throughout in such condition to the satisfaction of said Director.

5. THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS  
 METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION  
 TRAFFIC REGULATIONS  
 AND  
 RULES FOR DRIVING  
 - - - - -

Rule 1. No person shall drive an automobile or vehicle propelled by other than animal power, within any reservation or upon any road, driveway, parkway or bridge, in the care and control of the Metropolitan District Commission, except in designated places within any reservation or upon any road, driveway, parkway or bridge where such automobile or vehicle is allowed.

Rule 2. No person shall operate a motor vehicle on any land, roadway, driveway, parkway, or bridge under the care and control of the Commission at a rate of speed greater than is reasonable and proper having regard to traffic, the use of the way, and the safety of the public; and in no event in excess of the posted limits for such speed indicated by signs erected thereon by the Commission or its duly authorized agents.

Rule 3. No person shall park a motor vehicle within any reservation or upon any road, driveway, parkway or bridge, nor allow any vehicle to stand upon the travelled portion of any road, driveway, parkway or bridge, nor upon any grass areas adjacent thereto, except in places designated by signs or markings as parking spaces.

Rule 4. No person shall drive a vehicle or animal on any road, driveway, parkway or bridge, which is designated as being a oneway drive, except in the direction indicated by signs or markings placed thereon.

Rule 5. No automobile or vehicle shall be allowed upon the driveway of Revere Beach Reservation from Revere Street to the intersection of said driveway with Revere Beach Parkway during the hours of 2 o'clock P.M., to 12 o'clock P.M., inclusive, on any Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday occurring during the period extending from and including June 17 to and including Labor Day in each year.

Rule 6. No person shall drive a vehicle or animal except upon the travelled portion of the road, driveway, parkway or bridge, or upon other than the extreme right-hand side of the road, driveway, parkway or bridge, except when passing another vehicle or animal, or pass a vehicle or animal except to the left thereof. Drivers intending to turn from a roadway where there are two or more lines of traffic, shall, before making such turn, take a position in the line of traffic nearest the intended turn. No horse or vehicle shall be driven, backed, led, or allowed to stand on any sidewalk. A driver of a vehicle, in slowing or in turning, or in backing, shall signal, either by hand or whip, or by mechanical or automatic electrical device, indicating the direction about to be taken.

Rule 7. No person having control of a motor vehicle shall allow same to stand upon any parking space, road, driveway, parkway or bridge, without some person in charge of same or so secured that it cannot be moved except by a person in control of the mechanism thereof.

Rule 8. No person shall stop a vehicle so as to obstruct a road, driveway, parkway or bridge, or a sidewalk or crossing thereof, or so as to prevent the passing of other vehicles or otherwise than lengthwise with a road, driveway, parkway or bridge, and close to the curb thereof, and on the right hand side thereof in such manner that the front of the vehicle shall face in the direction in which said vehicle was moving when brought to a stop, unless otherwise permitted or directed, or within the intersection of any streets or opposite any streets that connect but do not cross, nor within twenty feet of a street corner, nor within ten feet of a hydrant. No person shall ride upon the rear or side of any vehicle or street car.

Rule 9. No person shall have or operate a motor vehicle which has a seating capacity of more than eight persons upon any road, driveway, parkway or bridge, the use of which is restricted to pleasure vehicles, in the care and control of the Metropolitan District Commission, without a written permit therefor by said Commission.

Rule 10. Police officers may divert vehicular traffic or pedestrian traffic when necessary to avoid congestion or promote safety and convenience, and no person having charge of a vehicle shall refuse or neglect to stop or place the same as directed by a police officer.

Rule 11. Every operator of a vehicle shall bring such vehicle to

a full stop before entering any road, driveway or parkway from an intersecting street, when directed to do so by a sign, signal or device. When directed to yield the right of way by a "Yield Right of Way" sign, he shall surrender to oncoming traffic his right to enter the intersection until such time as he has brought his vehicle to a complete stop at a point between the said "Yield" sign and the nearer line of the street intersection, provided however, that this requirement to stop before entering the intersection shall not apply when a driver approaching a "Yield" sign can enter the intersection in safety without causing interference to approaching traffic. Vehicles must stop so as not to interfere with or prevent the passage of pedestrians at crossings or pedestrian or other vehicles at intersections of streets. Where police officers are stationed or where a mechanical device is operated for the purpose of directing traffic, pedestrians must stop when directed to do so by the police officer or by the mechanical device, and drivers of vehicles must stop or go ahead as directed by the officer or as indicated by said mechanical device. In the case of a funeral procession this rule applies to the first car only.

Rule 12. No person shall signal or stop the operator of any vehicle or accost the occupants thereof for the purpose of soliciting a ride, or selling or distributing any merchandise, advertising matter, or ticket of admission to any game, show or entertainment.

Rule 13. The driver of a vehicle or other conveyance shall not make a turn from the way in which he is driving into another way or driveway at any point in the highway where such a movement is prohibited by signs, and shall obey the instructions of any official traffic control sign, signal, device, marking or legend, unless otherwise directed by a police officer.

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Any person violating any of the above rules shall for each offence be punished by a fine of not more than twenty dollars. (General Laws, Chapter 92, Section 37)

The Boston Edison Company shall place and maintain proper barriers at all times, and from the beginning of twilight through the whole of every night sufficient lights to protect the public from injury or damage during the progress of the work under this grant or during repairs upon said pole, guy wire and anchor, crossarms, standpipe connection, wires and fixtures, and work on the location which may hereafter become necessary.
6. No work shall be done under this grant without first obtaining a permit therefor from said Director of Park Engineering and subject to conditions imposed by him.

1. The Boston Edison Company shall conform to all provisions of law applicable to the exercise of the rights and performance of the work under this grant and to the rules and regulations of the Metropolitan District Commission.
  2. The Boston Edison Company shall do the work of installing said conduit, wires and cables in the location hereby granted subject to the approval of the Director of Park Engineering of the Commission as to time, manner and location and in all other respects.
  3. Said Boston Edison Company shall indemnify and save harmless the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the Metropolitan District Com-



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mission from any damage it or they may sustain or be required to pay arising out of the exercise by said Company of the rights hereby granted or by reason of any negligence of said Company or any of its employees in connection with the work done hereunder.

4. Said Boston Edison Company shall protect and maintain all trees, drainage or water pipes, and all appurtenances or structures either above or below the surface of the ground over which this location lies, and upon completion of the work shall restore the surface of the ground to the condition in which it was at the time of this grant and in a manner satisfactory to said Director of Park Engineering of the Commission, and shall maintain the surface of the ground and the location throughout in such condition to the satisfaction of said Director.

5. The Commission V O T E D: Held over.
