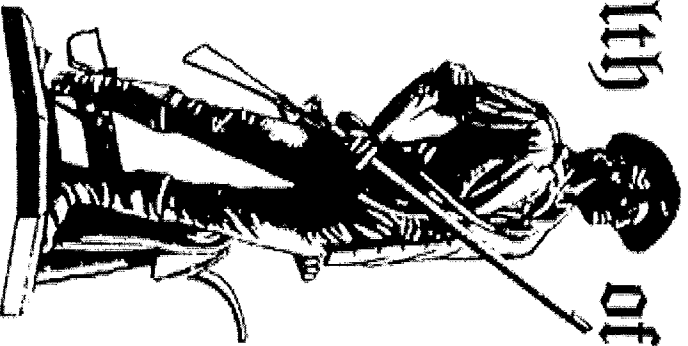

- Whereas** Recent student housing fires in North Carolina, Wisconsin, New York and Pennsylvania have tragically cut short the lives of some of the youth of our nation; and
- Whereas** Since January 2000, over 125 people, including students, parents, and children have died in student housing fires; and
- Whereas** A majority of students across the nation live in off-campus occupancies, and over three-fourths of fire deaths occurred in off-campus housing; and
- Whereas** A number of fatal fires have occurred in buildings where the fire safety systems have been compromised or disabled by the occupants; and
- Whereas** Automatic fire sprinkler systems are a highly effective method of controlling or extinguishing a fire in its early stages; and
- Whereas** As students return to campuses across the Bay State this month, it is important to remind them of fire prevention and safety, hopefully reducing loss of life from this hazard,

**Now, Therefore, I, Deval M. Patrick**, Governor of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, do hereby proclaim September 2010 to be,

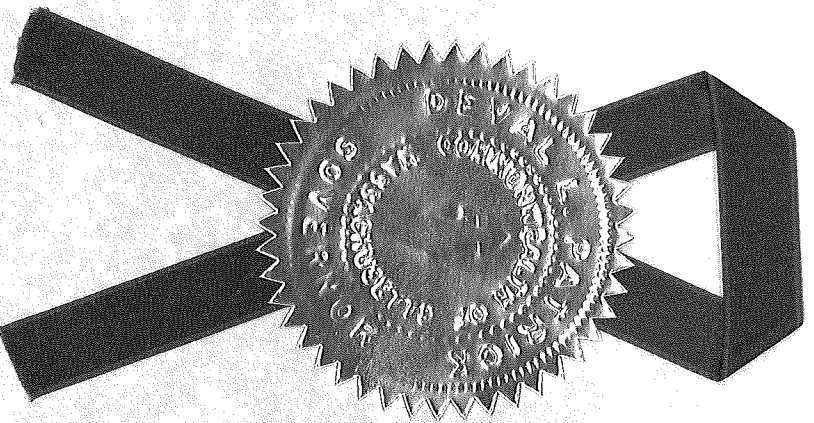
## CAMPUS FIRE SAFETY MONTH

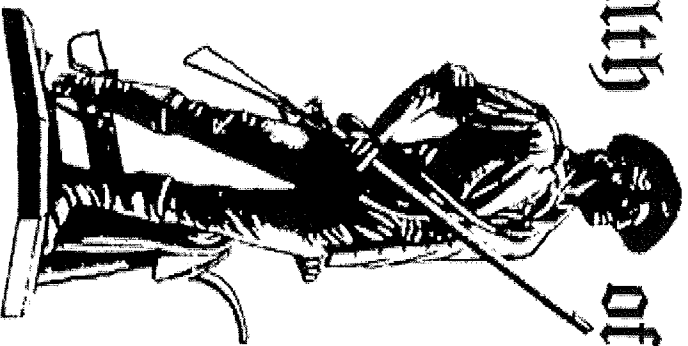

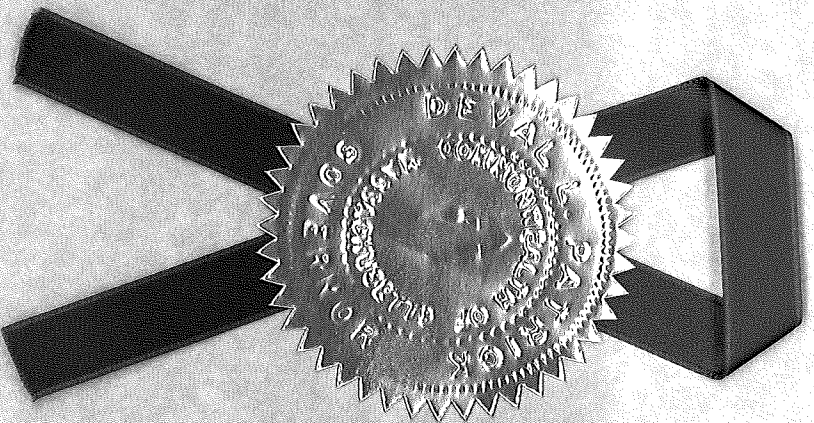
