A Proclamation

His Excellency Governor Deval L. Patrick

Whereas Autism is a neurological condition which affects approximately 1% of the population; and

Whereas Currently, 1 to 1.5 million Americans live with an autism spectrum disorder; and

Whereas Early diagnosis and intervention of autism lead to significantly improved outcomes; and

Whereas Proper accommodations can aid autistic persons to achieve their full potential; and

Whereas In 2010, Massachusetts joined the growing list of states that require autism to be defined as a medical condition for insurance purposes; and

Whereas The unemployment rate among autistic adults is extremely high, despite their ability to be valuable employees if given the proper working conditions; and

Whereas It is in our interest to promote an environment of acceptance, respect and inclusion for autistic individuals; and

Whereas Through public awareness, the Commonwealth of Massachusetts seeks to minimize the negative effects of autism among all Massachusetts residents,

Now, Therefore, I, Deval L. Patrick, Governor of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, do hereby proclaim April 2011, to be,

AUTISM AWARENESS MONTH

And urge all the citizens of the Commonwealth to take cognizance of this event and participate fittingly in its observance.
