## A Proclamation

His Excellency Governor Deval L. Patrick

**Whereas** Down Syndrome is a genetic difference occurring in about one of 800 to 1000 births; and

**Whereas** Down Syndrome is caused by an extra 21<sup>st</sup> chromosome, resulting in a person having three copies instead of two copies of this chromosome; and

**Whereas** Most children born with Down Syndrome will experience delay in physical, cognitive and language development and individuals with Down Syndrome vary in their mental and physical abilities; and

**Whereas** Today with loving homes, available therapies, advanced medical care, better early education and greater social acceptance, people with Down Syndrome live full and productive lives; and

**Whereas** Through public awareness, the Commonwealth of Massachusetts seeks to ensure that individuals with Down Syndrome are valued, included and live fulfilling lives within the community,

**Now, Therefore, I, Deval L. Patrick**, Governor of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, do hereby proclaim October 2011 to be,

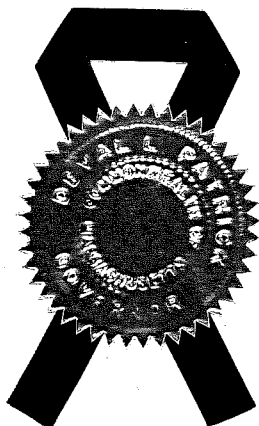
## DOWN SYNDROME AWARENESS MONTH
