Report of the Nine hundred seventy-third (973rd) meeting of the Metropolitan Park Commission, held at the offices of the Commission, 14 Beacon Street, Boston, on Friday, December 10, 1909, at 2 P.M.

Present, The Chairman and Messrs. Curtis, Skillings and Whitney.
The records of the preceeding meeting were read and approved.

The Secretary submitted the following matters from the

ENGINEER

- 1 Report, dated December 4, on condition of bridges in the care and control of this Commission.

V O T E D that the Secretary direct the Superintendents to have the recommendations made as to bridges in their respective divisions carried out in accordance with said report, the cost thereof to be charged to Maintenance.

- 2 Report, dated December 3, on request of Chelsea Gas Light Company, dated December 1, for location for gas main in sidewalk of Revere Beach Parkway. V O T E D that the following permit issued by the Secretary under date of December 3, be ratified and approved:

Permit: Permission is given to the Chelsea Gas Light Company to extend their gas main in sidewalk of Revere Beach Parkway, Chelsea, for the purpose of connecting the present pipe with the Campbell Avenue main, as shown on plan filed in the Engineering Department of this Commission entitled, "Plan Showing Proposed Extension of Chelsea Gas Light Co. Main, Chelsea, Mass. Scale 1" = 40'", indexed Accession Number 7937^x, on the following terms and conditions:- Said gas main shall be laid subject to the approval of the Engineer of this Commission as to time, manner and location, and shall be laid and maintained in repair at the cost of said Company. All drainage and other structures shall be protected and maintained, and the surface of the ground shall be restored to its original condition, to the satisfaction of said Engineer. No portion of said Parkway shall thereafter be dug up or opened without obtaining previous authority in writing from the Metropolitan Park Commission or its duly authorized officer or agent, except in case of emergency for repairing a break, said Company may enter upon the premises for the said purpose without previous notice, on the understanding and agreement that said Commission shall be notified and the necessary permit obtained immediately thereafter, and whenever said Parkway is opened for the purpose of making said changes or repairs, the premises shall be restored to their former condition to the satisfaction of said Commission and at the expense of said Company. All changes and repairs caused by the construction or maintenance of the Parkway or other causes shall be made at any time as required by said Commission, or its officer or agent, at the cost of said Company. Said main shall not be removed until, and shall be removed when directed by this Commission, and on violation of any term of this permit the said Commission or its agents may remove said main at the expense of said Company. This permit is issued on the understanding and agreement that said Company will hold the Commonwealth harmless and indemnified against all claims for loss or damage to persons or property arising out of the exercise of this permit.

- 3 Report, dated December 3, on request of Robert J. Jones for entrance of Jones Road into Winthrop Parkway.

V O T E D that the Engineer be directed to leave entrance for said road whenever the parkway is completed at that point, curbs to be set at the corners in the usual manner, and charged to the cost of construction of said parkway.

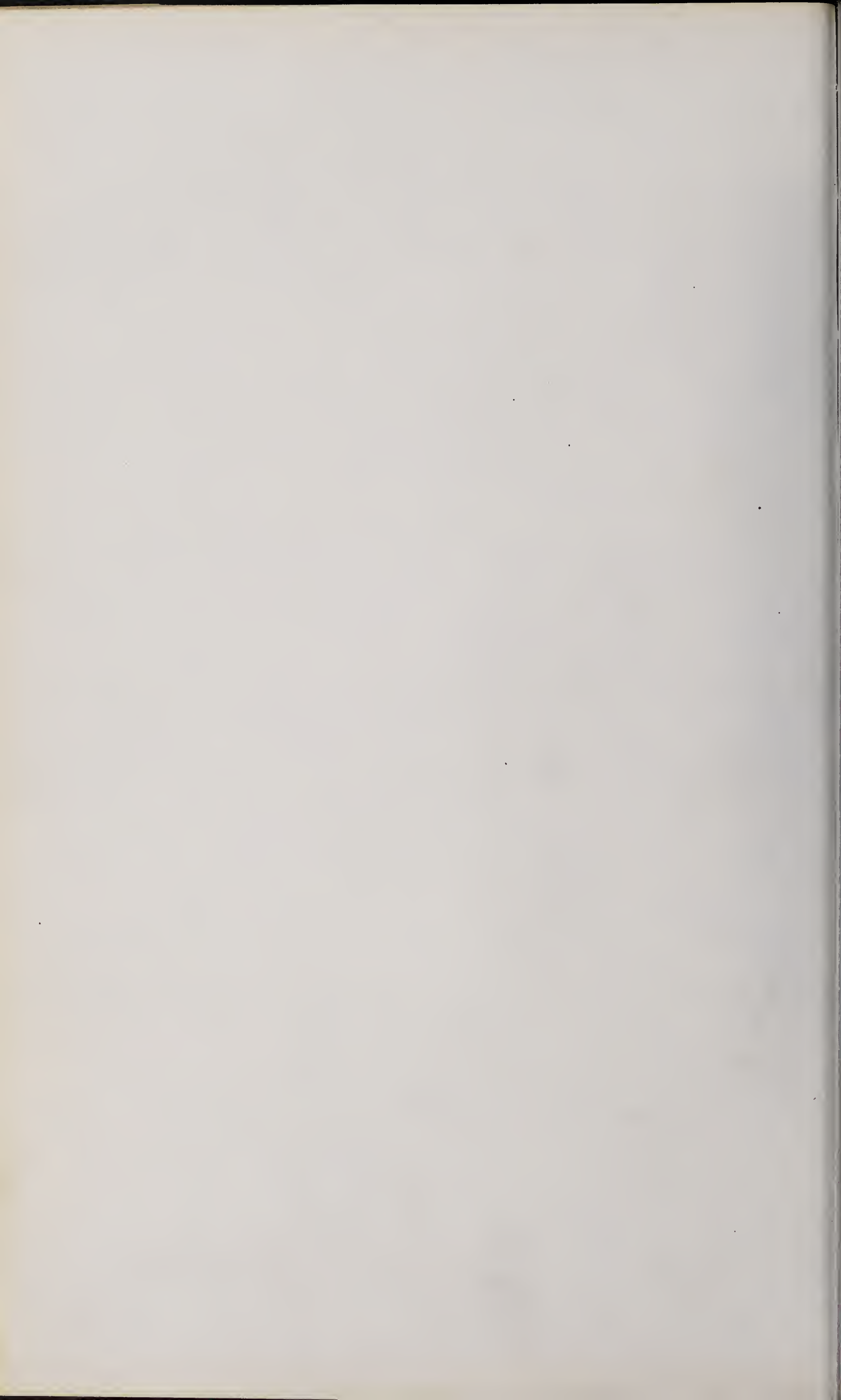

2 WHEREAS, the undersigned, duly appointed and qualified as the Board known
 as the Metropolitan Park Commission, under and by virtue of the provisions
 of an Act of the Legislature of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, entitled
 "An Act to establish a Metropolitan Park Commission," being Chapter 407 of
 the Acts of the year 1893, deem it desirable and expedient to take the
 lands and rights in land hereinafter described for the purposes and under
 the powers and limitations set forth in said Act and in Chapter 450 of the
 Acts of the year 1895 and any and all other Acts in addition thereto and in
 amendment thereof;

NOW, THEREFORE, we, said Board of Metropolitan Park Commissioners, by vir-
 tue of the authority conferred upon us by said Acts and of any and every
 other power and authority us hereto in any wise enabling, acting herein in
 consultation and concurrence with the proper local board, being the Board
 of Park Commissioners of the Town of Revere, have taken and do hereby take
 in fee in the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and for the benefit
 of the said Commonwealth and the inhabitants thereof, in manner prescribed
 in and by said Acts, and for all the purposes therein provided, the lands
 and rights in land and all easements, privileges and appurtenances of every
 name and nature thereto belonging, being a parcel lying in the Town of Re-
 vere in the County of Suffolk and shown on a plan marked "Commonwealth of
 Massachusetts, Metropolitan Park Commission, Revere Beach Reservation, Plan
 of Taking in Revere of a portion of Bath St. *** May 23, 1906, John R. Rab-
 lin, Engineer," being Metropolitan Park Commissioners' plan No. 523, the
 original of which is to be recorded herewith, and the duplicate of which is
 on file in the official archives of said Commissioners, and bounded and de-
 scribed as follows, viz:-

Beginning at a point at the intersection of the Easterly side line of Ocean
 Avenue with the Southerly side line of Bath Street and at the extreme
 Northwesterly corner of land of John J. Hurley as shown on said plan No.
 523 to be recorded with Suffolk Deeds; thence running North 9° 49' 10" East,
 across the location of Bath Street, Fifty (50) feet to the intersection of
 said Easterly side line of Ocean Avenue with the Northerly side line of
 Bath Street at the extreme Southwesterly corner of land of Marcella A.
 Kirby; thence turning and running South 80° 17' 0" East by said Northerly
 side line of Bath Street and by said land of Marcella A. Kirby, One hundred
 seven and fifty-one hundredths (107.51) feet to land of said Commonwealth
 included in a prior Taking for said Revere Beach Reservation; thence turn-
 ing and running Southwesterly, nearly Southerly, curving to the left with
 a radius of Eighteen thousand forty-three and sixty-four hundredths feet,
 by said Revere Beach Reservation, Thirty-two and twenty-eight hundredths
 (32.23) feet to a stone bound; thence continuing Southwesterly, nearly



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Southerly, curving to the left with a radius of Fifty-four hundred ten feet, still by said land of said Commonwealth, Seventeen and seventy-seven hundredths (17.77) feet to the Southerly side line of Bath Street at land of John J. Hurley; thence turning and running North 80° 17' West by said Southerly side line of Bath Street and by said land of John J. Hurley, One hundred five and thirty-six hundredths (105.36) feet to the point of beginning; containing Fifty-three hundred twenty-one square feet, more or less, according to said plan to be recorded herewith and being a portion of the location of said Bath Street. Comprising land of John J. Hurley and Marcella A. Kirby.

Intending to take and hereby taking in fee each and every tract, estate or parcel, or part thereof, included within the foregoing description or howsoever otherwise bounded or described and be said measurements, or any of them, more or less.

Acting in accordance with the law, they have proceeded now for three months on the assumption that the appropriations for this year would be at least as large as those of last year, but in view of the uncertainty as to what the action of the Ways and Means Committee is to be, they have given orders to all their departments to reduce the number of employees and all expenses to the lowest practicable limit until the amount of the appropriation is fixed. They feel that this is an unfortunate position to be compelled to take for it is already time to prepare for the spring work of putting the parks and especially the parkways into condition for the period of their largest use, and also necessitates the suspension of protective work against the gypsy and browntail moths.

Perhaps the most unfortunate delay is on the items called for to repair the damage from the storm of last December. The roadways at Revere and Winthrop are in terrible condition, and at Nantasket and Lynn there are conditions that should be remedied at once to avoid danger of further injury in case another unusual storm should occur.

Under these conditions the Commission feel justified in calling to your attention the facts in the case and in asking you, and through you, your Committee, that its estimates may be forwarded in the shape of appropriation bills as soon as the public interest will permit.

The reading of the records of the preceding meeting was postponed.

The Commission considered matters relating to the

CHARLES RIVER DIVISION, LOWER BASIN.

- 1 Mr. Arthur Binney submitted plans, preliminary specifications and estimates for police boats for use on Charles River Basin.

V O T E D that Mr. Binney be employed as naval architect on terms stated in his letter of January 19, 1910.

V O T E D that Mr. Binney be requested to complete plans and specifications for 36-foot launch and two 25-foot launches in accordance with the preliminary plans submitted and obtain proposal for building the same from George Lawley & Son Corporation of South Boston.

- 2 The Secretary submitted draft of rules and regulations prepared by the Law Department for the government and use of the Charles River Basin.

V O T E D that the following rules and regulations for the government and use of the Charles River Basin be and hereby are adopted.

THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS
METROPOLITAN PARK COMMISSION
R U L E S A N D R E G U L A T I O N S
FOR THE GOVERNMENT AND USE OF THE
C H A R L E S R I V E R B A S I N

The Charles River Basin, hereinafter called the Basin, as defined by chapter 524 of the acts of the year 1909, includes the dam and the lock, highway, park, drawbridge or sluiceway constructed in connection with said dam, the wall, embankment, park, parkway or street constructed under authority of said chapter, the Charles River and the waters thereof, including the public navigable arms, tributaries and inlets thereof, whether covered by ice or not, lying between said dam and the lower dam across said river at Watertown, and all lands taken by eminent domain under authority of the Charles River Basin Act.

RULE 1. No person shall cut, break, remove, deface or defile any building, structure, fence, sign, bush, plant, turf, rock, or other thing belonging to the Commonwealth, or have possession of any part thereof. No person shall walk or trample upon the grass plots or planted spaces lying between Charles Gate West and the highway on the dam.

RULE 2. No person shall have possession of or discharge any destructive weapon, firearm, firecracker, torpedo or firework; or make a fire; or post, paint, affix or display any sign, notice, placard or advertising device; or drop or place and suffer to remain any piece of paper or other refuse, except in the receptacles designated therefor; or engage in business, sell, or expose for sale, or give away any goods, wares, or circulars.

RULE 3. No person shall solicit any subscription or contribution from another; or have possession of or drink any intoxicating liquor; or play any game of chance; or have possession of any instrument of gambling; or preach; or pray aloud; or make an oration or harangue, or any political or other canvass; or move in a military or civic parade, drill or procession; or play any musical instrument except by written authority from said Metropolitan Park Commission.

RULE 4. No person shall ride or drive an animal or vehicle except upon the driveways; or upon other than the right hand side of the road except when passing another animal or vehicle; or past an animal or vehicle going in

the same direction except to the left thereof; or across a road unless the right of way is given to all other animals or vehicles, or by the side of any vehicle except for the purpose of immediately passing such vehicle; or hitch a horse or other animal to a fence, tree, bush or shrub.

RULE 5. No person shall drive an automobile or vehicle propelled by other than animal power past a vehicle or animal going in the same direction without sounding a horn or bell or other mechanical warning.

RULE 6. No person shall stop an animal or vehicle otherwise than lengthwise with a parkway or driveway and close to the sidewalk thereof.

RULE 7. No person shall ride or drive an animal or vehicle faster than at the rate of fifteen miles an hour.

RULE 8. No person shall have or allow a vehicle for carrying merchandise; or a vehicle in use for carrying merchandise or articles other than the equipments proper for a pleasure vehicle; or a hearse or any vehicle in a funeral procession; except upon a traffic road, or to gain access by the shortest way from the nearest street to the front entrance of a house facing on the Basin.

RULE 9. No person in charge of any animal, other than a dog, shall allow it to go upon the Basin unless such animal be used for pleasure travel on a way or place provided therefor.

RULE 10. No person having charge of an animal or vehicle shall neglect or refuse to stop, place, change the position of or move said animal or vehicle as directed by a police officer.

RULE 11. No person having charge of an animal shall allow the same to stand without some proper person to take charge of the same, except that an animal hitched to a place provided therefor, or to a weight of not less than twenty pounds, may be allowed to stand unattended for not more than five minutes.

RULE 12. No person shall have or allow any dog upon that part of the Basin in Boston lying between Charles Gate West and the highway on the dam unless such dog is held by such person by a leash not longer than seven feet.

RULE 13. No person shall refuse or neglect to obey any reasonable direction of a police officer.

RULE 14. No person shall have in his control or operate an automobile or motor vehicle which has about or affixed to any wheel or the tire of any wheel thereof either a chain or rope of metal or other material upon any road, driveway or parkway in the Basin, except upon the highway upon the dam.

RULE 15. No person shall skate with roller-skates upon the sidewalks or paths in said Basin.

RULE 16. No person shall enter or be upon the ice in any part of said Basin unless at the time there shall be displayed by said Metropolitan Park Commission within a distance of 2,400 feet from the point where such person is, a written or printed sign or notice stating in substance that skating is at the time allowed, or unless at the time such person shall have a written permit to be upon the ice from said Metropolitan Park Commission.

RULE 17. No person shall have, sail or use an ice-boat upon that part of said Basin which lies northerly and northeasterly of, or down stream from, Harvard Bridge or Massachusetts Avenue.

RULE 18. No person shall have or ride or drive a horse or motor vehicle upon the ice in said Basin; or cut holes in or deface or defile the ice in said Basin.

RULE 19. No person shall spit upon any sidewalk or path in the Basin.

RULE 20. No person shall navigate, run or drive a boat propelled by a steam, naphtha, gasoline, electric, or other motor or engine at a speed exceeding the rate of twelve miles an hour.

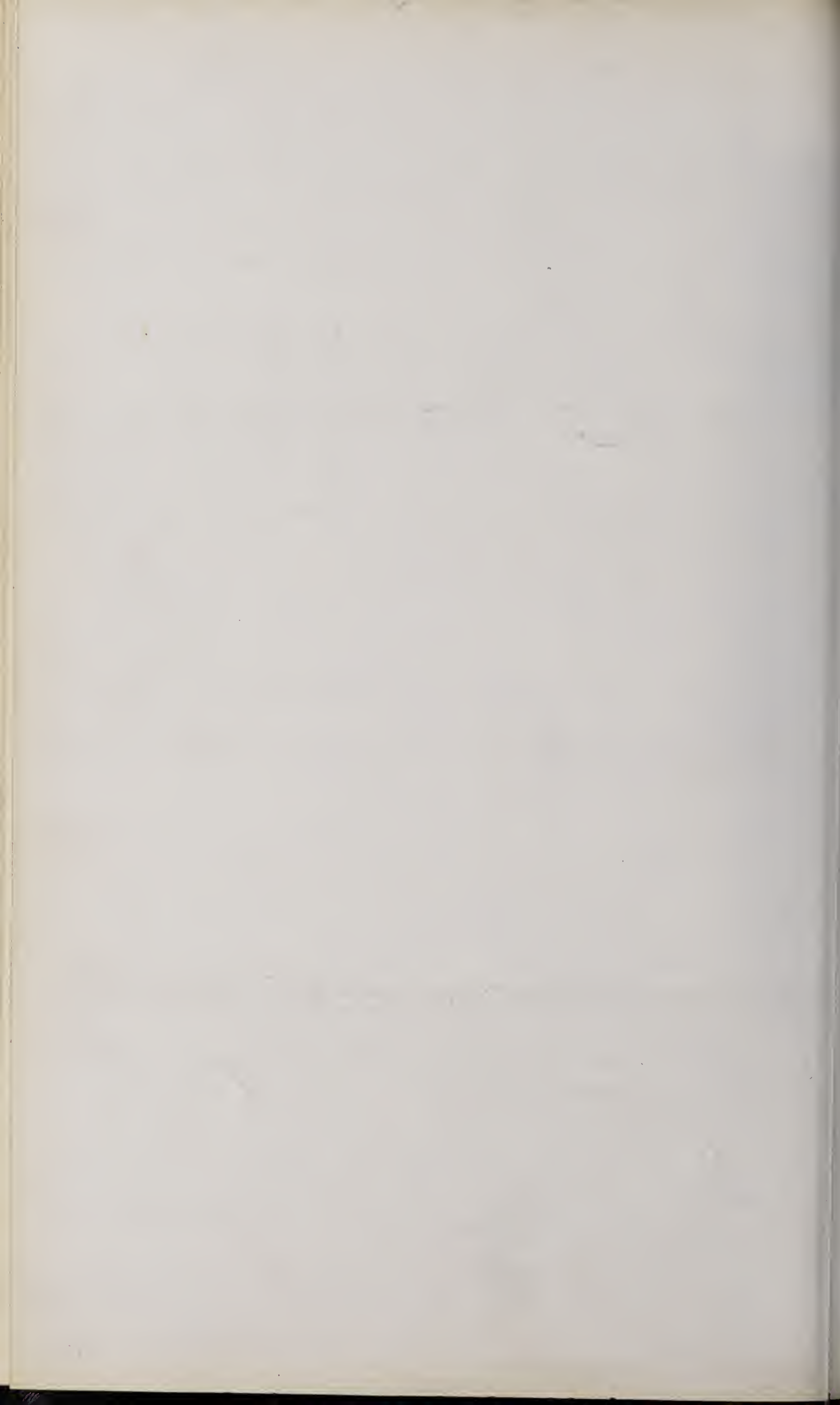

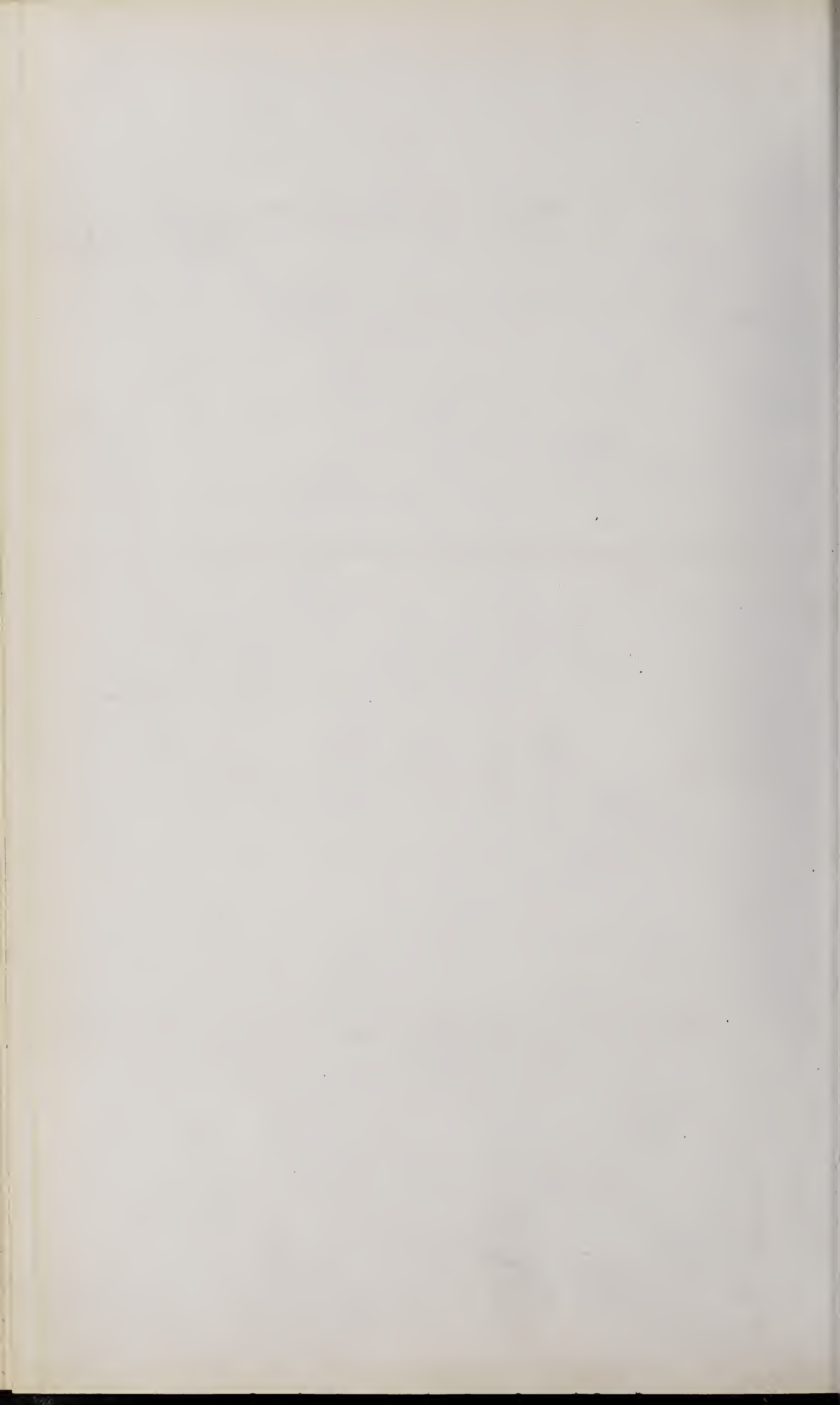

- RULE 21. No person shall, except with written authority from, or at points designated by, said Metropolitan Park Commission, anchor or moor any vessel, boat, raft or float in the Basin, or fish in the waters of the Basin.
- RULE 22. No person shall dump or deposit ashes, garbage, paper, refuse or materials of any nature within said Basin, except in receptacles designated for the purpose.
- RULE 23. During the hours between sunset on any day and sunrise on the next succeeding day, no person shall navigate, or cause to be navigated, upon the waters of said Basin any boat or vessel, unless there shall be displayed upon said boat or vessel on the bow, head or foremast thereof a bright white light so constructed as to show an unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of twenty points of the compass, so fixed as to throw the light ten points on each side of the bow of such boat or vessel, namely, from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on either side, and of such a character as to be visible at a distance of at least two hundred feet.
- RULE 24. During the hours between sunset on any day and sunrise on the next succeeding day, no person shall navigate, or cause to be navigated, upon the waters of said Basin any boat or vessel propelled by a steam, naphtha, gasoline or other engine or motor, or by the use of sails, unless there shall be displayed upon such boat or vessel (1) on the starboard side, a green light so constructed as to show an unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of ten points of the compass, so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on the starboard side and of such a character as to be visible at a distance of at least two hundred feet and fitted with an inboard screen so as to prevent the light from being seen across the bow; (2) on the port side a red light so constructed as to show an unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of ten points of the compass, and so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on the port side, and of such a character as to be visible at a distance of at least two hundred feet, fitted with an inboard screen so as to prevent the light from being seen across the bow.
- RULE 25. In navigating the waters of the Basin, any person in control of a canoe, boat, barge, raft or vessel shall observe and obey the following rules and regulations:
- (a) A boat or vessel propelled by steam, naphtha, gasoline, electric or other engine or motor shall be kept out of the way of a vessel propelled by wind and sails.
 - (b) A canoe or boat propelled by oars shall be kept out of the way of a boat or vessel propelled by wind and sails.
 - (c) A vessel or boat propelled by wind and sails, while running free, shall be kept out of the way of a vessel or boat propelled by wind and sails which is close hauled; a vessel or boat propelled by wind and sails which is close hauled on the port tack shall keep out of the way of a vessel or boat propelled by wind and sails which is close hauled on the starboard tack; when two vessels or boats propelled by wind and sails and running free are approaching each other with the wind on different sides, the vessel or boat which has the wind on the port side shall be kept out of the way of the other; when two such boats or vessels are running free with the wind on the same side, the vessel which is to the windward shall be kept out of the way of a vessel or boat which is to the leeward. Any such vessel or boat which has the wind aft shall be kept out of the way of such other approaching vessel or boat.
 - (d) When vessels or boats propelled by machinery are approaching each other head and head, that is, end on, each shall be made to pass on the port side of the other, and the person in control of any such boat or vessel

 con.- to be answered promptly by a similar blast of a whistle, and thereupon such

(e) When two vessels or boats propelled by machinery are crossing the course, the one of the other, the vessel or boat which has the other on her starboard shall be kept out of the way of the other.

(f) Every vessel or boat overtaking another shall be kept out of the way of the vessel being overtaken.

Any person violating any of the above rules may be punished by a fine of not more than fifty dollars for each offence. (Acts of 1909, Chapter 524, Section 5.)

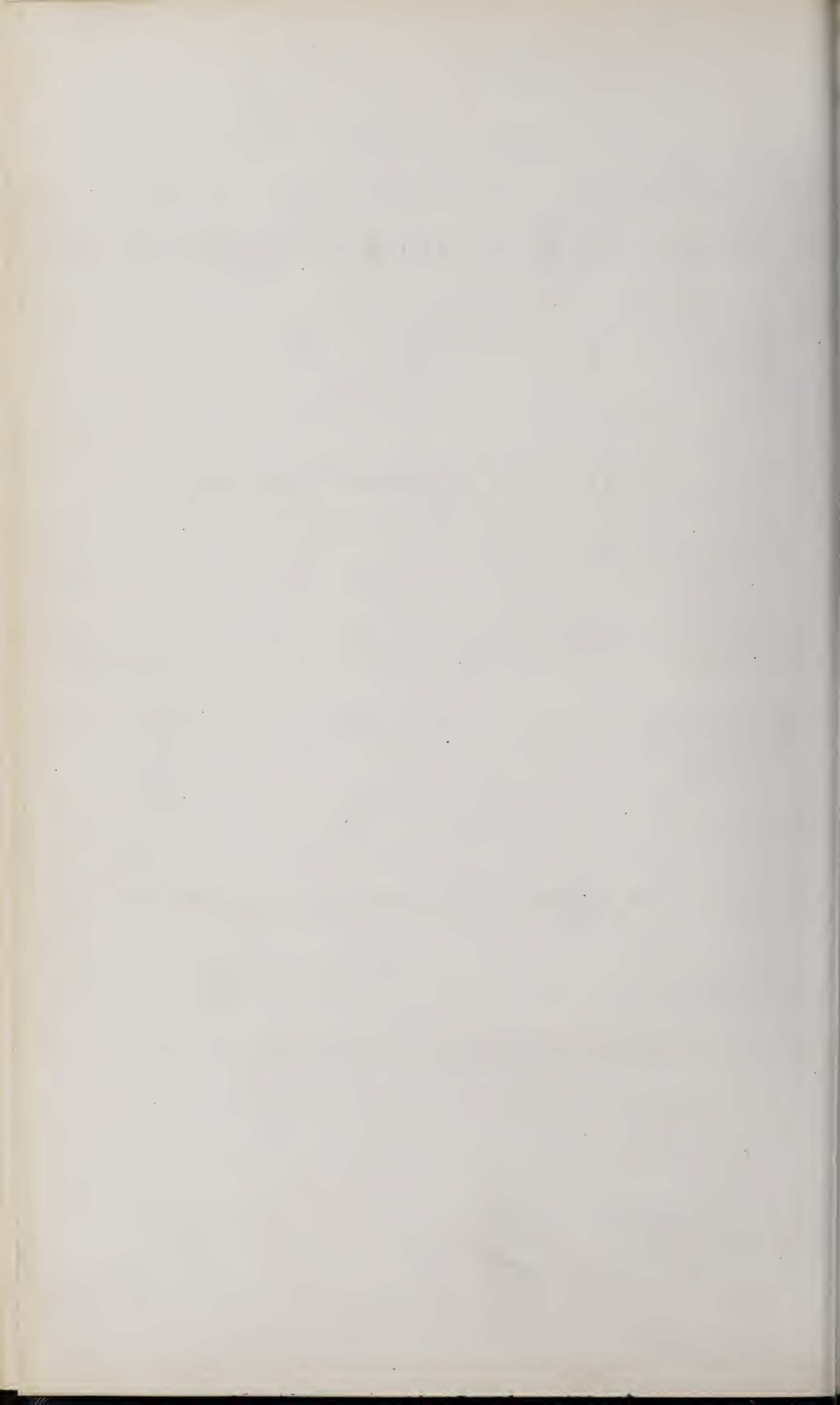

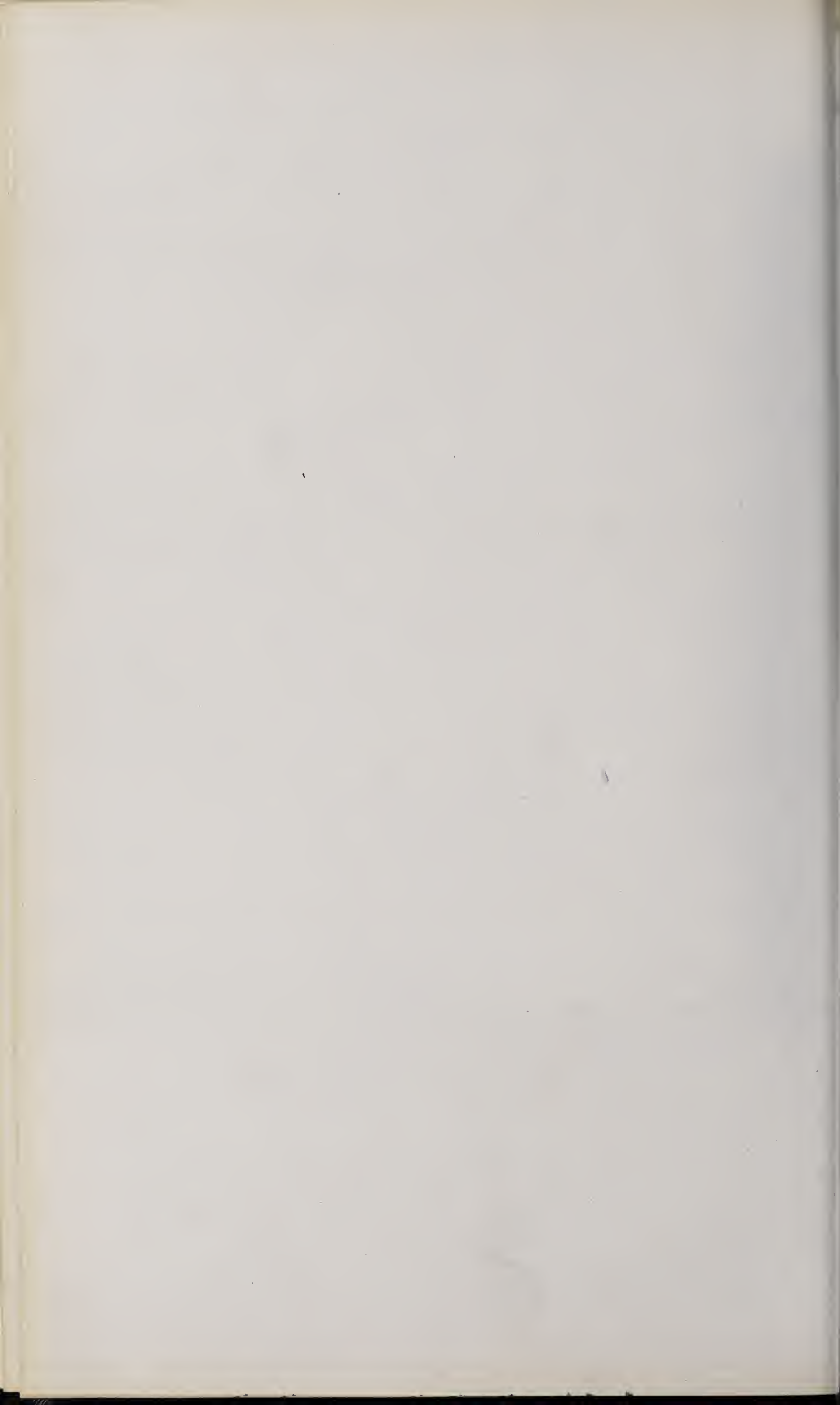

From Harvard Bridge to Cottage Farms, on the Cambridge, or northerly, side, moorings to be allowed from within 300 feet of Harvard Bridge to the end of the embankment wall, to be distant not less than 200 feet nor more than 350 feet from the embankment wall.

On the southerly, or Boston, side, moorings to be allowed from entrance of Fenway Basin to Deerfield Street, within about 150 feet of the embankment wall.

Also, within the section 100 feet distant from the embankment wall from Granby Street to Chilmark Street.

From Cottage Farms Bridge to River Street, on the northerly, or Cambridge, side, from Cottage Farms Bridge to Captain's Island bathing beach, moorings to be allowed within 100 feet of the river bank.

On the southerly, or Brookline, side, moorings to be allowed from St. Alphonsus Club's floats to tower house of the Boston & Albany Railroad, and south of a line drawn between these two points.

Also, moorings to be allowed within 100 feet of the embankment from the River Street Bridge about 1000 feet easterly.

Between River Street and Western Avenue, on the southerly, or Boston, side, moorings to be allowed within a line drawn from the southerly bridge abutment of the River Street Bridge and the end of the draw pier of the Western Avenue Bridge.

In the section between Western Avenue and North Harvard Street, on the southerly, or Boston, side, moorings to be allowed within 50 feet of the river bank from North Harvard Street Bridge 1000 feet easterly.

Rablin, Engineer," the original of which is on file at the office of said Commission, and a copy of which is annexed to this grant, which plan is referred to for a more specific description of the location herein granted.

Said company is also hereby granted the right to locate permanent switches and turnouts, as shown on said plan hereto annexed, as a part of the location of tracks herein granted.

Said company is also hereby granted, subject to the approval of the Governor and Council as required by law, the right to erect and maintain at points indicated on said plan hereto annexed, the necessary poles for the support of the overhead single trolley system of electric motive power, together with the right to use and operate its railway by said system. Said Company, however, shall not maintain feed wires upon the location herein granted.

II

TERMS, CONDITIONS AND OBLIGATIONS.

1. Said company shall furnish the Commission free of charge electrical current sufficient to enable said Commission to operate at all times the drawbridge on said highway over which this location lies.
2. Said company shall lay and maintain upon the location herein granted rails of a character approved by the Engineer of the Commission. Said company shall also lay and maintain upon the location herein granted between tracks and rails and eighteen inches outside of the outer rails, such paving or road surfacing as the Engineer shall approve.
3. Said company shall remove from the highway on the dam so much of the snow cleared by said company from its rails and from between its tracks and from a space eighteen inches outside of the outer rails as said Commission may direct and in a manner satisfactory to said Commission.
4. Specifications for all work to be done by said company under this grant, and detailed plans of work to be done hereunder shall be prepared by the company and approved by the Engineer of this Commission, and all work of construction under this grant, the kind and quality and material used, the style, character and location of poles, and location of tracks shall at all times be satisfactory to and approved by the Engineer of this Commission.
5. No work of repair, relocation or reconstruction upon this location shall be carried on without a written permit from the Commission except in the case of ordinary repairs of wires, poles, or joints, or except in cases of emergency when written notice of such emergency work shall be given the Commission as soon as practical after said work is begun.
6. During the occupation and use of this location by said company all spaces made use of in connection therewith shall be kept in as good condition and appearance as the rest of said highway and to the approval of this Commission so far as reasonably can be done, and whenever any work of repair or reconstruction shall have been done the part of said highway affected or made use of shall be restored promptly to its normal condition, and in case of any failure so to do, the Commission itself shall care for or restore the same as and when it may deem it necessary, keeping account of the expense occasioned thereby and shall charge the same to said company and said company shall pay all expenses occasioned by such work as the same may be certified to it by said Commission.
7. The Commission also reserves the right to make such further reasonable

orders from time to time as may be necessary in regard to operating upon the location herein granted, or as to the location, alteration or suspension of the use of the location, which are not inconsistent with the terms of this grant, nor with provisions of law governing the same, and also such further orders, subject to the same limitations, as it may deem necessary for the public safety and convenience, or to provide for the alteration, repair or rebuilding of said highway, including the space of this location, or its use for any other purpose for which this Commission may lawfully permit or use said highway.

8. In operating over this location the company shall provide such appliances and safeguards, and make such other provision for the safety of those using the cars, tracks, equipment and location, and said highway in general outside of said location, not inconsistent with the general provisions of law as are legally operative and binding in and upon this location, and which do not unreasonably impair the service of the company, as the Commission may from time to time require, either specifically or by general rules and regulations, providing, however, that if the company shall deem any requirement of said Commission under this eighth paragraph of the terms, conditions, etc. of the location unreasonable, it may appeal therefrom to the Governor and Council whose decision thereon shall be final.

9. Said company agrees to hold the Commonwealth and its agents harmless and indemnified against all claims for loss or damage to persons or property arising out of the exercise by said company of the rights and privileges herein granted.

10. The failure of said company, after reasonable notice, to comply with any of the terms, conditions and obligations of this grant or with any provision of law applicable thereto shall constitute sufficient grounds for revoking the location granted hereunder, subject to an appeal to the Governor and Council as provided by law.

11. The word "Commission" or a pronoun in place of it, in this grant shall mean the Metropolitan Park Commission of Massachusetts, or any other commission, board, or officer, having for the time being the care and control of the spaces upon which this location lies.

The word "Engineer", or a pronoun in place of it, shall mean the person holding the position or acting in the capacity of Chief Engineer of the Commission with respect to the care, maintenance and control of the spaces upon which this location lies.

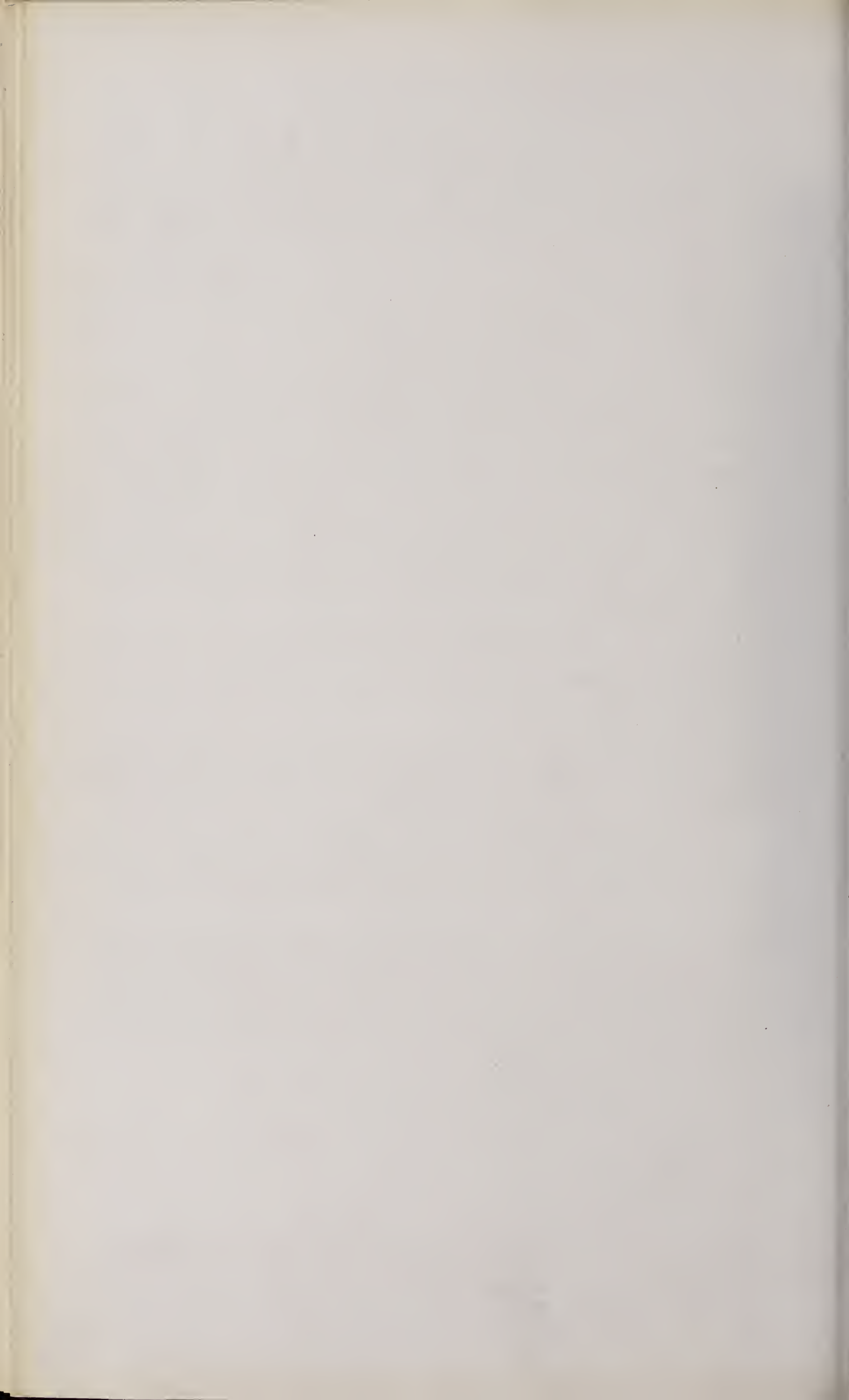

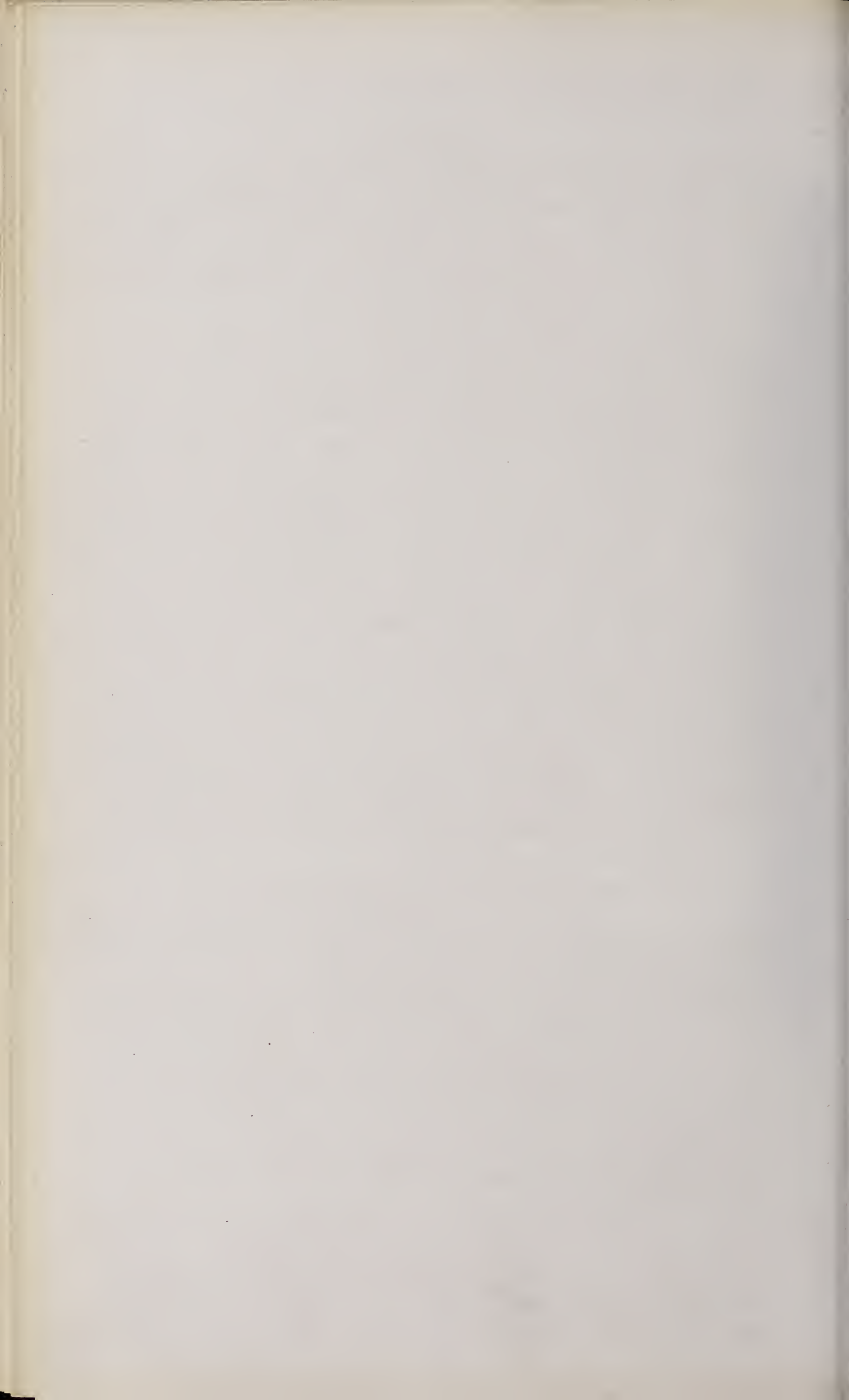
HEARING

O T E D that the Assistant Secretary be empowered to buy such new, or to have repaired such old, clothing, including helmets or caps, as his judgment dictates, and that he report to the Commission not later than December 1, 1911, the number of uniforms or parts of uniforms which he finds it necessary to buy in addition to the new uniforms authorized by the Commission for the ensuing summer season.

V. O T E D that sections 3, 4 and 5 of Rule 3 "Of Pay" of the rules and regulations of the Police Department be amended to read as follows:

Section 3. When a police officer is absent from duty on account of sickness or injury caused by unusual exposure or exertion while on duty, and such sickness or injury is certified to by some reputable physician or surgeon approved by the board, full pay for lost time may be allowed. It is to be understood, however, that the mere fact that an injury was received while on duty does not necessarily justify the allowance of full pay. A police officer must take the ordinary risks of an officer, and he is entitled to full pay only when he suffers an injury while in the discharge of a police duty of a perilous character. A police officer, for instance, while patrolling his route may slip and injure himself without having a just claim for full pay; but should he slip while chasing a criminal or stopping a runaway horse, he would have such claim.

When a police officer is absent from duty on account of ordinary sickness or injury, and such sickness or injury is certified to by some reputable physician or surgeon approved by the board, half pay for lost time will be allowed for not exceeding thirty days.

Section 4. Pay will not be allowed during absence from duty to attend funerals unless the relationship between the decedent and the applicant is

con.- that of father, mother, wife, child, brother, sister, or wife's father or mother, brother or sister, and in no case for more than one day unless the superintendent or officer in charge of the division shall certify that a longer absence was allowed by reason of the distance traveled in order to attend a funeral within the Commonwealth or for the purpose of making arrangements for the funeral.

Section 5. No pay for lost time will be allowed except as provided in these rules or specifically required by law. No pay for lost time will be allowed when the sickness or disability is feigned or simulated; or when it arises from carelessness, improper or vicious conduct, excessive indulgence of appetite or other bad habits; or from improper, illegal or immoral practices; or if the sick or injured person shall fraudulently, by concealment, false statement, or otherwise seek to deceive or mislead the attending physician or surgeon in relation to his case; or if the member shall not remain at his residence, unless permitted by the board to go elsewhere, or if he refuses or neglects to conform to the instructions of the attending physician or surgeon. No pay for lost time shall be allowed an officer unless he petitions therefor to his superintendent or the board and such petition is accompanied by the certificate of the physician or surgeon as required by the rules.

V O T E D that section 13 of Rule 5 of said rules and regulations be amended to read as follows:

Section 13. No officer shall be paid any fee or extra compensation for official services performed by him in any criminal case, or for testifying as a witness in a criminal case during his hours of duty for which he receives his salary; but his expenses, necessarily and actually incurred, and actually disbursed by him in a criminal case tried in the Superior Court, may be collected by him from the county in which the trial is held, and in a criminal case tried in a police, district or municipal court or before a trial justice of the city or town in which the crime was committed.

V O T E D that ^{the} votes of June 18, 1902, relative to the collection and disposal of witness fees of officers in the Nantasket Beach Division, and the vote of July 8, 1903, relative to the same matter at the Revere Beach Division, be and hereby are rescinded; and that general order of August 27, 1900, be revoked, and the following general order be issued in place thereof, namely, expenses collected by an officer in a criminal case shall be paid over by him to the Superintendent of the division whenever the same have been advanced to the officer by the Superintendent.

V O T E D that copies of said sections of said rules as thus amended, also copies of the foregoing vote, be sent to the Superintendents with the following instructions:

Attention of the Superintendents is directed particularly to the following conditions to be observed in order that an officer may obtain pay or half pay for absence owing to sickness or injury:

(1) In all cases the officer must make application in writing to his Superintendent or to the Board.

(2) If full pay is claimed because the absence was due to sickness or injury caused by unusual exposure or exertion while on duty:- (a) the fact of sickness or injury must in any case be certified to by some reputable physician or surgeon approved by the Board; (b) the fact that the sickness or injury was caused by unusual exposure or exertion must be certified by such physician or surgeon; (c) the fact that the unusual exposure or exertion occurred while the officer was on duty must be certified by the Superintendent or doctor or by both in cases of doubt.

(3) If half pay is claimed the petition for the same must be accompanied

1045th by the certificate of a reputable physician or surgeon.
 Fr. 15, 1911 (4) Where the certificate of a reputable physician or surgeon approved
 con.- by the Board is required, the Superintendent or officer required to obtain
 such a certificate need not first inquire what physician or surgeon would
 be approved by the Board. This must be left in the first instance to the
 judgment of the Superintendent or officer interested, the Board reserving
 the right to require or designate some other physician or surgeon.

In relation to Section 13 of Rule 5, the attention of the Superintendents
 is called to the case of Sackett v. Sanborn, 205 Mass. 110, in which the
 meaning of S. 44 of C. 204 of the Revised Laws, upon which said Section 13
 is based, is discussed by the court, and to the following language of the
 court in reference thereto:-

"The object of the statute is to provide that officers who receive com-
 pensation for their services by salary or otherwise, and attend court in
 the discharge of duties which they are thus paid to perform, shall not re-
 ceive further compensation by way of witness fees, but that any expenses ne-
 cessarily and actually incurred or disbursed by them in the performance of
 such duties in attending court in criminal cases shall be reimbursed to
 them. If they attend court, but not in the performance of the duties for
 which they are paid, at a place other than their residence, then, * * * *
 they are to be allowed witness fees."

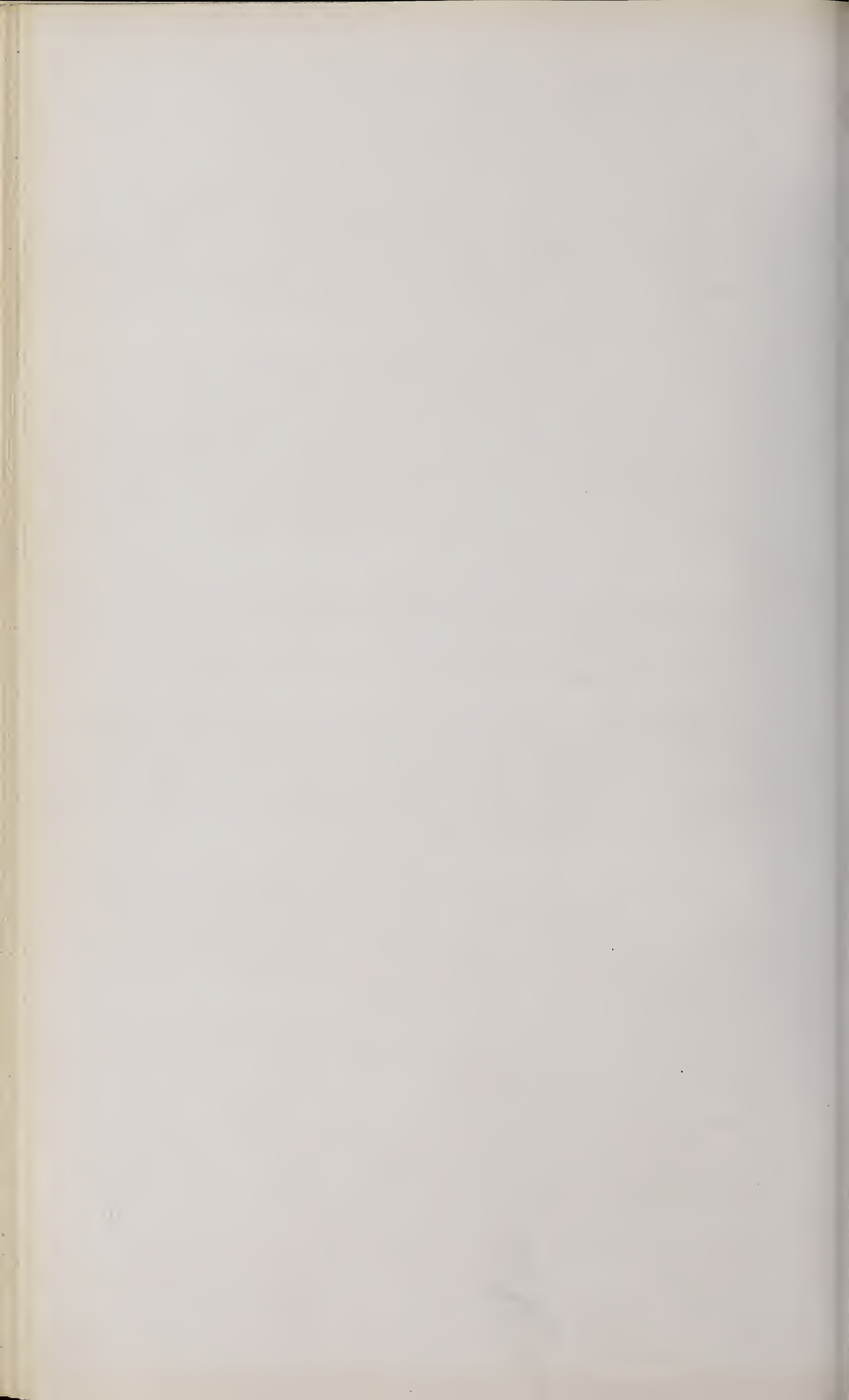

1046th Report of the One thousand forty-sixth (1046th) meeting of the Metropolitan
Mar. 22, 1911 Park Commission, held at the offices of the Commission, 14 Beacon Street,
Boston, on Wednesday, March 22, 1911, at 1.30 P.M.

Present, The Chairman and Messrs. Curtis, Skillings and Benton.
The reading of the records of the preceding meeting was postponed.

CONFERENCES

- 1 The Board held a conference with representatives of the Cities of Cambridge and Somerville and of the Towns of Arlington and Belmont, relative to amendment of Chapter 529 of the Acts of the year 1906 so as to provide further funds for completing the work on Alewife Brook. At the end of the conference the representatives of said cities and towns expressed the view that an additional appropriation of \$15,000 to be levied upon said cities and towns as provided in said Act would either be approved or, at least, not opposed, by said cities and towns.
- 2 The Board also held a conference relative to the assessment of betterments for the construction of Charles River Embankment as provided by Chapter 402 of the Acts of the year 1906, with Thomas M. Babson, Esq., of the Law Department of the City of Boston who appeared as representing the Mayor of Boston as shown by letter of the Secretary of the Mayor, dated March 21, which was before the Board. At this conference the estimates of benefits, prepared by Salem D. Charles, one of the Street Commissioners of the City of Boston, was submitted to Mr. Babson, and also the estimates of John C. Kiley, John H. Donovan, Alonzo F. Andrews, and Francis R. Bangs. Upon the question of the limit to which the assessment of said betterments should extend, Mr. Babson expressed the opinion that the assessment should be limited to the area bounded southerly, southwesterly and southeasterly at Charlesgate East by Beacon Street to Brimmer Street, by Brimmer Street to Pinckney Street, by Pinckney Street to Charles Street and by Charles Street to Cambridge Street. Mr. Babson also expressed the opinion that it would be satisfactory if the estimates of betterments prepared by Mr. Charles were accepted for the betterment assessments within the above described limits, provided Mr. Charles did not wish to change the proportions of said estimates in view of the limitation of the area of assessments above set forth. At the end of the conference it was
