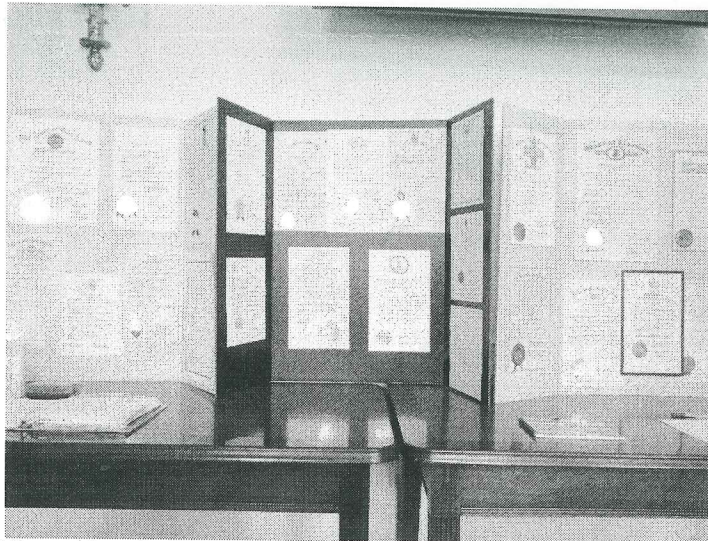
Dear Governor Patrick:

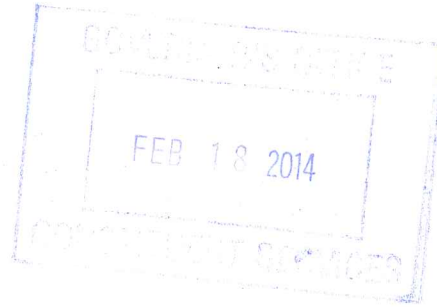
In just seven years Pollinator Week has grown into an international celebration of invaluable ecosystem services provided by bees, birds, butterflies, bats and beetles. In 2013, 36 states declared their own state Pollinator Week. In 2014 we hope to reach 100% state participation. One recommendation of the landmark National Academy of Sciences and National Research Council study, *Status of Pollinators in North America*, was an immediate increase in public awareness of the vital roles pollinators play in our lives. By again declaring your state's Pollinator Week, you will be helping to do exactly that.

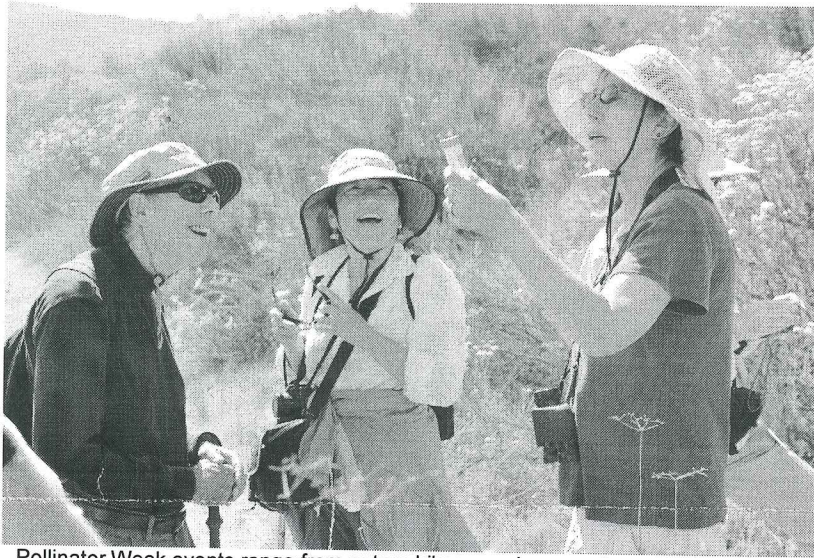

WHEREAS, pollinator species such as birds and insects are essential partners of farmers and ranchers in producing much of our food supply; and

WHEREAS, pollination plays a vital role in the health of our national forests and grasslands, which provide forage, fish and wildlife, timber, water, mineral resources, and recreational opportunities as well as enhanced economic development opportunities for communities; and

WHEREAS, pollinator species provide significant environmental benefits that are necessary for maintaining healthy, biodiverse ecosystems; and

WHEREAS, the State of Massachusetts has managed wildlife habitats and public lands such as STATE forests and grasslands for decades; and

WHEREAS, the State of Massachusetts provides producers with conservation assistance to promote wise conservation stewardship, including the protection and maintenance of pollinators and their habitats on working lands and wildlands; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Governor Patrick, Governor of the State of Massachusetts, do hereby proclaim the week of June 16-22, 2014 as

Massachusetts Pollinator Week

throughout the State of Massachusetts, and urge all citizens to recognize this observance.
