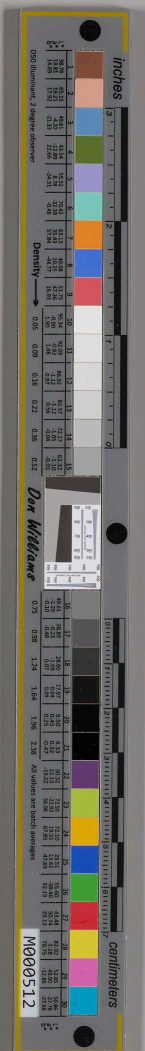
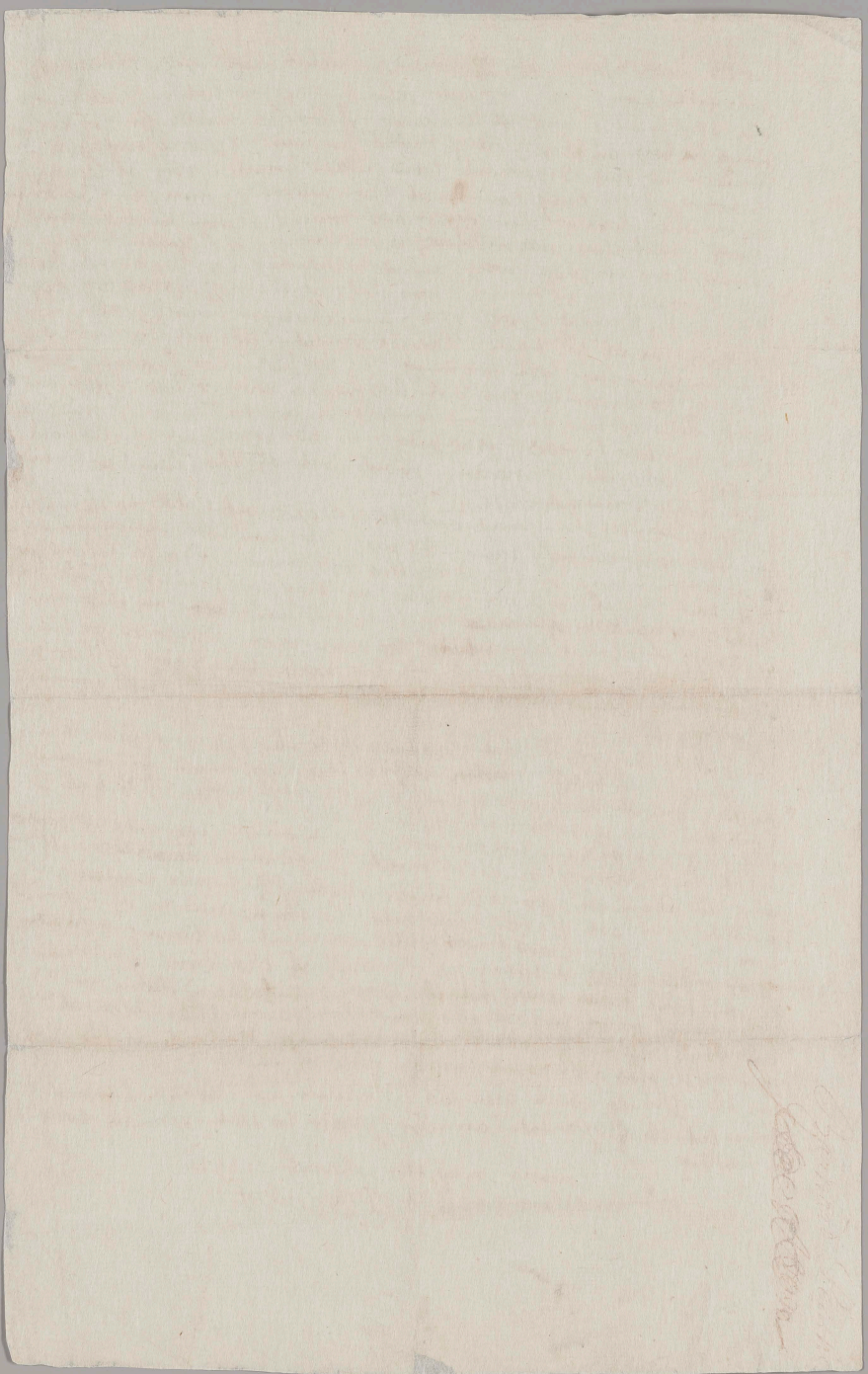


The day after of Birman's death aged 43. at this about
