No portion of said Parkway shall thereafter be dug up or opened without obtaining previous authority in writing from the Metropolitan Park Commission, or its duly authorized officer or agent, except in case of emergency for repairing a break said Company may enter upon the premises for the said purpose without previous notice, on the understanding and agreement that said Commission shall be notified, and the necessary permit obtained immediately thereafter, and whenever said Parkway is opened for the purpose of making said changes or repairs the premises shall be restored to their former condition to the satisfaction of said Commission and at the expense of said Company. All changes and repairs caused by the construction or maintenance of the Parkway or other causes shall be made at any time, as required by said Commission, or its officer or agent, at the cost of said Lynn Gas & Electric Company. Said gas main shall not be removed until, and shall be removed when, directed by this Commission; and on violation of any term of this permit the said Commission or its agents may remove said pipe at the expense of said Company. This permit is issued on the understanding and agreement that said Company will hold the Commonwealth harmless and indemnified against all claims for loss or damage to persons or property arising out of the exercise of this permit.

Rablin, Engineer," being Metropolitan Park Commissioners' Plan No. 572, Sheets, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6, the originals of which are to be recorded herewith, and the duplicates of which

V O T E D: That on the petition of the Directors of the Boston and Northern Street Railway Company dated September 19, 1906, for a street railway location beginning at a point in the boundary line between the City of Medford and the Town of Stoneham in the Middlesex Fells Reservation and thence running Northerly through said Middlesex Fells Reservation to the boundary line of said Reservation at the junction of Main and South Streets in the Town of Stoneham, which petition is on file in the office of this Board and to which reference is hereby made, a hearing on said petition having been given by this Board on Monday, February 10, 1908, at 2 P.M., at the office of the Metropolitan Park Commission, Room 507, 14 Beacon Street, Boston, of which hearing due notice was given to all persons interested of the time and place of said hearing, in accordance with law, namely, by publishing a copy of said petition and the order of notice issued thereon by this Board, the first publication thereof having been made at least fourteen days prior to the date of said hearing in a newspaper published in the Town of Stoneham, said location lying wholly in said Town of Stoneham and in no other city or town, and it appearing in the opinion of this Board that public convenience and necessity so require, the prayer of said petition is hereby granted to the extent and upon the terms, conditions and obligations hereinafter specified, stated and imposed, the same being such as the public necessity and a due regard for the rights of the Commonwealth require, namely:-

I.

LOCATION OF TRACKS, POLES, WIRES, &C.

Said Company is hereby granted a location for two tracks in said Middlesex Fells Reservation beginning at or near the intersection of Main and South Streets in said Town of Stoneham and thence running in a southerly direction through said Middlesex Fells Reservation to the Medford-Stoneham town line near Porter's Cove, so-called, in Spot Pond and to and connecting with the terminus of the location granted by this Board March 6, 1907, to the West End Street Railway Company.

The location of tracks herein granted is substantially shown by four parallel red lines on a plan entitled "Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Metropolitan Park Commission, Middlesex Fells Reservation, plan of track location to be granted to Boston and Northern Street Railway Company in Stoneham *** March 21, 1906, John R. Rablin, Engineer," the original of which is on file at the office of said Commission and reference to which is hereby made for a more specific description of the location herein granted.

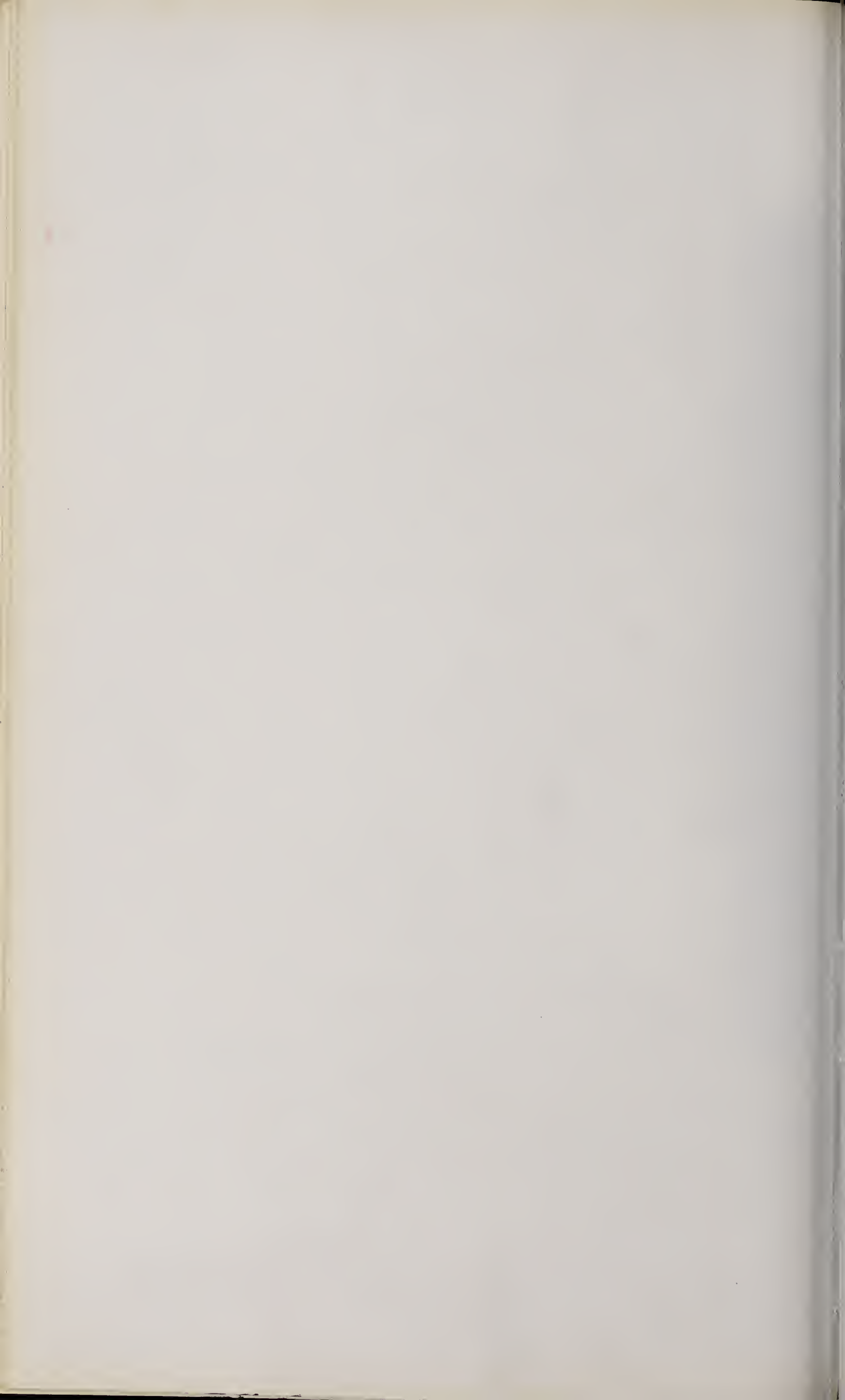
Said Company is also hereby granted the right to locate such temporary or permanent curves, switches and turnouts, necessary or convenient from time to time in the use and operation of the railway hereby located, as this Board may from time to time approve as incidental to the use of the locations hereby granted and shown on said plan.

Said Company is also hereby granted, subject to the approval of the Governor and Council, as required by law, the right to erect and maintain the necessary poles for the support of the overhead wire system for the operation of its railway by the overhead single trolley system of electric motive power, together with the right to use and operate its railway by said system.

II.

TERMS, CONDITIONS AND OBLIGATIONS.

First: The company shall construct a suitable roadbed for its tracks over the location herein granted. The form of construction shall be such as the company shall approve except as hereinafter provided, and provided, also,



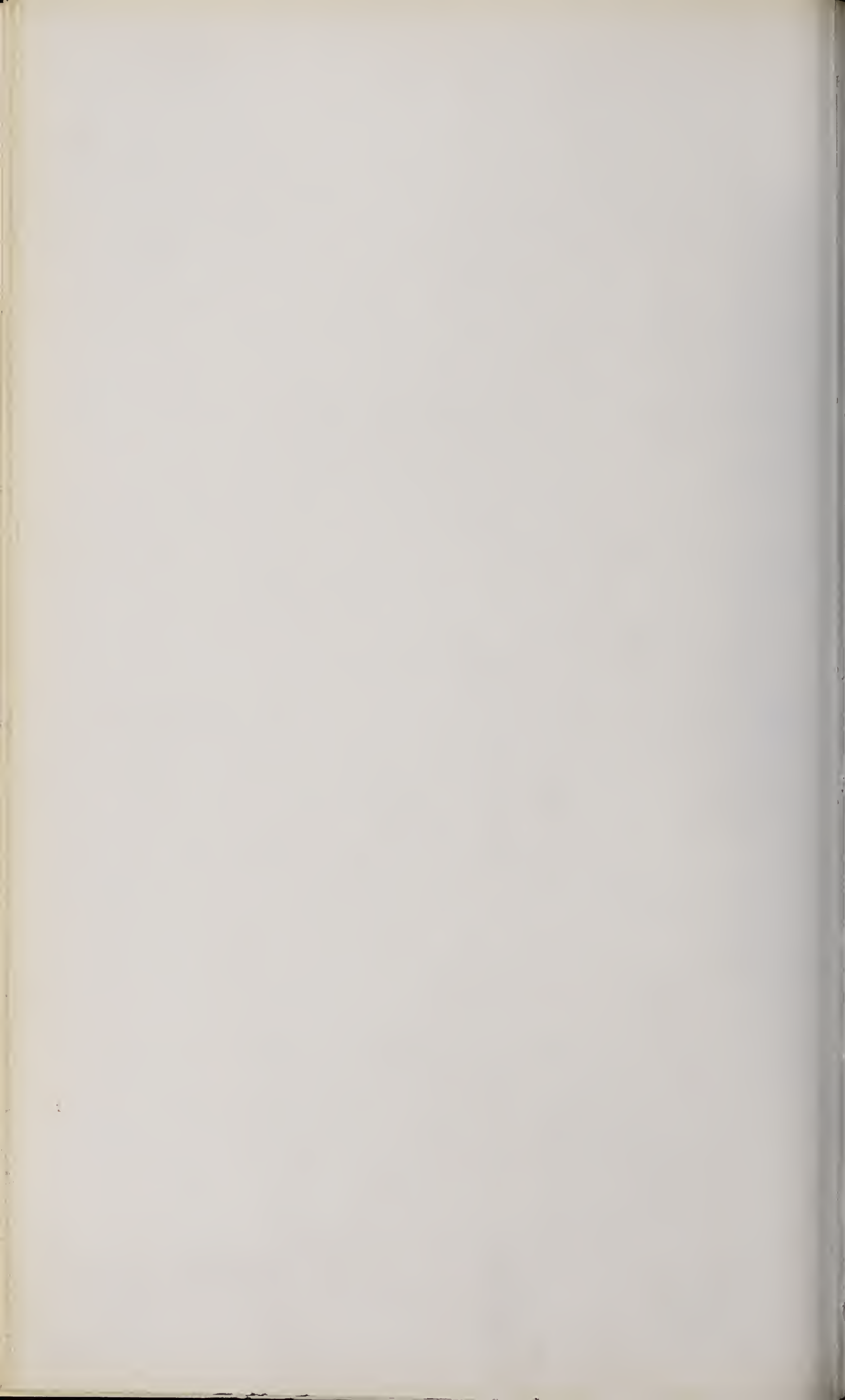
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that no part of the roadbed or location shall consist of pile or trestle work. The company shall also carry its tracks over roads crossed by the location at or near points "A" and "B" on said plan of location by bridges which shall be built and maintained by said company at its own expense; provided, however, that the company shall not be required to construct said bridges, and the abutments thereof, at a reasonable cost to said company exceeding the sum of Twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000), said cost to be determined by the engineer of said commission.

Second: Specifications and plans for all work to be done by the company under this grant, including plans for the bridges above referred to, shall be prepared by the company and approved by the Engineer of this Commission before any work upon this location shall be begun by the company. The work of construction of said bridges shall be done to the satisfaction of the Engineer of this Commission. The style, character, and location of poles shall at all times be satisfactory to and approved by the Engineer of this Board. The company may use sufficient and proper "T" rails upon the location except at points where the location shall cross at grade roads now or hereafter constructed, at which points the company shall use such rails as the Commission shall require.

Third: The work of construction on the location herein granted shall not be begun without an additional permit required of all who carry on work within the Reservation and when begun, shall proceed according to the terms of the permit and the written orders from time to time given by the Board or its officers and agents, and shall be prosecuted diligently to completion with all such safeguards for the protection of the public as may be reasonably required by the Commission from time to time. The work of construction of the entire location, including a roadbed for two tracks, and the work of laying a single track, together with such turnouts as said Commission may deem necessary for the use of a single track, shall be completed, and the operation of cars upon a single track shall be begun, within one year from the acceptance of this location, or within such further reasonable time as said Commission may determine upon request of the company for an extension of time and for good cause shown. The work of construction of a second track throughout the entire location shall be completed and operation of cars over the same shall be begun within six months from the date of notice to said company from said Commission directing said second track to be constructed; provided, however, that said Commission shall not require said company to construct said second track within a period of two years from the date of the acceptance of this location by said company. No work of repair, relocation or reconstruction shall be carried on without a permit similar to the one hereinabove specified, except in the case of ordinary repairs of wires, poles or joints.

Fourth: Upon and after the construction of said location, and during the occupation of this location by said company, all spaces made use of in connection therewith shall be placed and kept in a condition and appearance satisfactory to this Commission. The company shall remove promptly from the limits of the Reservation, or to such point in the Reservation not exceeding a mile in distance from the work as the Engineer of the Commission may direct, all debris or surplus material from work of construction upon said location, the time and manner of doing the work to be to the satisfaction of the Commission, and in case of failure so to do the company shall pay the expense occasioned to the Commission by removing said debris or surplus material, said expense to be ascertained and certified to said company by said Commission. Said Company shall remove in a manner satisfactory to



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the Commission, all snow displaced by it in the maintenance and operation of its railway where this location crosses highways, driveways, paths or roads at grade.

Fifth: The word "location" shall be deemed to mean herein the space occupied by the roadbed, including bridges and culverts, poles and wires, and any slopes of cuts and fills occasioned by the construction of said roadbed, and fences on the location.

Sixth: Said company (hereinafter referred to in this section as the "Grantee") shall whenever requested so to do by said Board make traffic agreements with any other street railway company which shall have acquired a location connecting with the location herein granted, to receive and operate the cars of such other company over the location herein granted; any such traffic agreements shall, in addition to any other matters which may be agreed upon by the parties, provide in substance as follows: That the cars of such other company while on the locations of the Grantee shall be operated by the latter, and all cars of such other company shall be in all respects subject to the approval of the Grantee and of such design, construction and equipment as shall be suitable for operation over the tracks of the Grantee in connection with its other cars and without damage to such tracks, to such other cars or to persons or property; that all cars of such other company shall be received and operated upon regular time tables to be agreed to by the respective companies. That the Grantee shall be entitled to collect and retain for its own use such fares from all passengers upon cars received from any such other company and from all passengers riding upon such cars while on its locations as the Grantee would collect and retain from passengers on its own cars operated over the same route, and all such passengers having paid fare while on the locations of the Grantee shall be entitled to the same transfer privileges as those to which passengers on its own cars operated over the same route are entitled. Said traffic agreement, unless otherwise agreed to by the Grantee, shall contain a provision that such other company shall make no charge for the use of its cars while on the locations of the Grantee and shall hold the Grantee harmless from any damage caused to persons or property by reason of defects in such cars and the Grantee shall hold such other company harmless from all damage to persons or property due to negligence in the operation of such cars while on the locations of the Grantee. If this Commission at any time acquires the right to operate electric railways the Grantee shall receive and operate the cars of this Commission on the same terms as hereinbefore provided as to other companies.

Seventh: The Commission reserves the right to make such further reasonable orders from time to time as may be necessary in regard to operating upon the location herein granted, or as to the location, alteration or suspension of the use of the location, which are not inconsistent with the terms of this grant, nor with the general provisions of law governing the same, and also such further orders, subject to the same limitations as it may deem necessary for the public safety and convenience, or to provide for the care, improvement or construction of any part of the reservation, including the space of this location, or its use for any other purpose for which this Commission may lawfully permit or use said reservation.

Eighth: In operating over this location the Company shall provide such appliances and safeguards, and make such other provision for safety of those using the cars, tracks, equipment and location, and the parkway in general outside of said location, not inconsistent with the general provisions of law and with such orders and requirements of the Board of Railroad Commissioners as apply to and regulate the use by said company of other

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parts of its location connecting with the location herein granted, and which do not unreasonably impair the service of the Company, as the Commission may from time to time require, either specifically or by general rules and regulations, providing, however, that if the Company shall deem any requirement of said Commission under this eighth paragraph of the terms, conditions, etc. of the location unreasonable, it may appeal therefrom to the Governor and Council whose decision thereon shall be final.

Ninth: Said company agrees to hold the Commonwealth and its agents harmless and indemnified against all claims for loss or damage to persons or property arising out of the exercise by said company of the rights and privileges herein granted.

Tenth: Said Company shall pay the Commonwealth of Massachusetts for the use of the location herein granted the sum of One Dollar per annum for a period not exceeding ten years from the date of the completion of the work of construction of said location for the use of a single track as determined by the Commission. Upon the expiration of ten years from the date of the completion of said construction of said single track, if this location shall then be in force, said company shall thereafter pay to the Commonwealth for the use of said location such sum per annum as may be agreed upon by said Company and said Commission, or if said Company and said Commission fail to agree, such sum as said Commission may determine; provided, however, that if said Company shall deem the sum determined by the Commission to be paid for the use of this location to be unreasonable, said Company, within sixty days from the receipt by it from said Commission of a written notice of the sum so determined upon by them, may appeal from such determination to the Governor and Council whose decision upon the sum to be paid by said Company for the use of this location shall be final.

Eleventh: Wherever the word "Commission" or "Board", or a pronoun in place of these words, is used in this grant of location, it shall be understood to refer to the Metropolitan Park Commission of Massachusetts acting for the Commonwealth, or any commission, board or officer duly authorized by the Legislature to act for the Commonwealth in the premises.

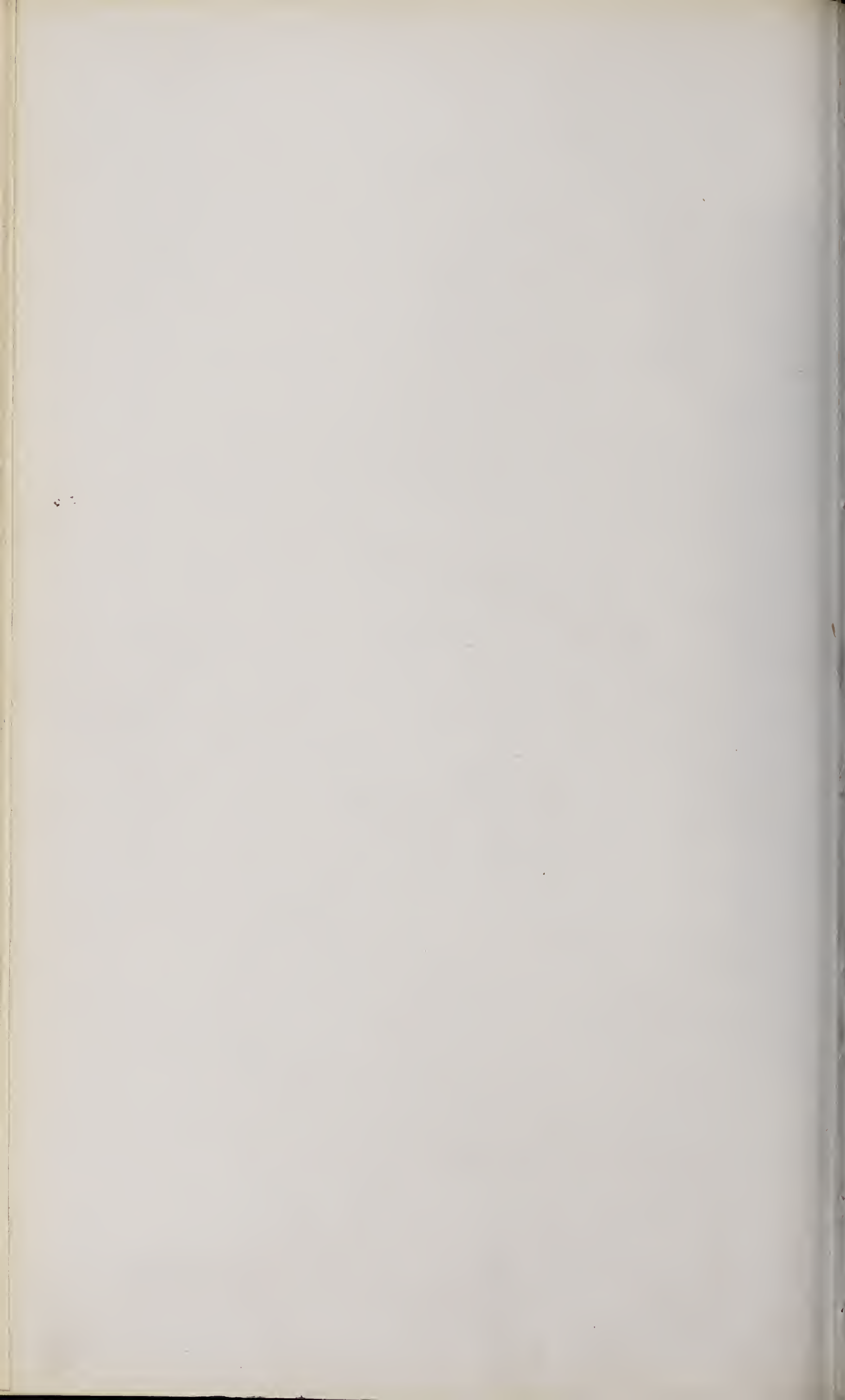
Wherever the word "Engineer", or a pronoun in place of it, is used in this grant of location, it shall be understood to refer to the person holding the position or acting in the capacity of the Engineer for the time being of the Commission.



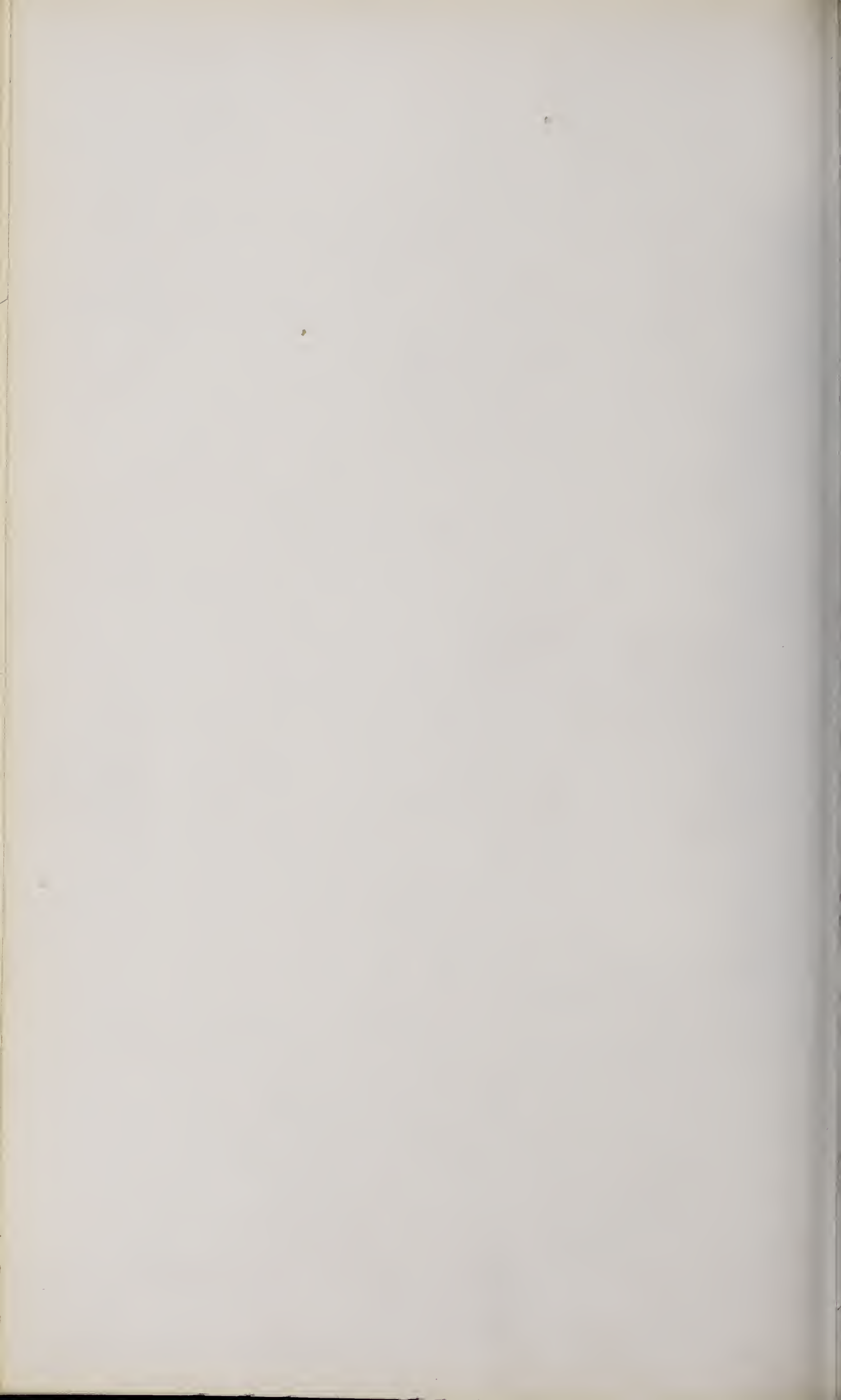

AS TO CHAINS AND OTHER DEVICES ON AUTOMOBILE WHEELS

No person shall have in his control or operate an automobile or motor vehicle which has about or affixed to any wheel or the tire of any wheel thereof either a chain or rope of metal or other material, upon any roadway, driveway, or parkway in the care or control of the Metropolitan Park Commission, except upon that portion of Blue Hills Parkway lying between Mattapan Square in Boston and Brook Road in Milton, upon the easterly driveway of Middlesex Fells Parkway between Middlesex Avenue in Somerville and Middlesex Avenue in Medford, or upon that portion of Nahant Beach Parkway extending from Washington Street in Lynn to Nahant Road in Nahant and lying westerly and in the rear of the Nahant Beach Bath House.

Any person violating the above rule shall for each offence be punished by a fine of not more than twenty dollars. (Revised Laws, Chap. 23, Section 30.)

No portion of said Parkway shall thereafter be dug up or opened without obtaining previous authority in writing from the Metropolitan Park Commission or its duly authorized officer or agent, except in case of emergency for repairing a break, said Company may enter upon the premises for the said purpose without previous notice, on the understanding and agreement that said Commission shall be notified and the necessary permit obtained immediately thereafter, and whenever said Parkway is opened for the purpose of making said changes or repairs, the premises shall be restored to their former condition to the satisfaction of said Commission and at the expense of said Company. All changes and repairs caused by the construction or maintenance of the Parkway or other causes, shall be made at any time as required by said Commission, or its officer or agent, at the cost of said Company. Said main shall not be removed until, and shall



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be removed when, directed by this Commission; and on violation of any term of this permit the said Commission or its agents may remove said main at the expense of said Company. This permit is issued on the understanding and agreement that said Company shall hold the Commonwealth harmless and indemnified against all claims for loss or damage to persons or property arising out of the exercise of this permit.

R U L E S A N D R E G U L A T I O N S GOVERNING THE USE OF

AUTOMOBILES AND VEHICLES PROPELLED BY OTHER THAN ANIMAL POWER.

RULE 1. No automobile or vehicle propelled by other than animal power shall be allowed within any reservation except upon town or county roads therein and upon Hillside Street in Blue Hills Reservation, Turtle Pond Road and Bold Knob Road in Stony Brook Reservation, Charles River Road in Watertown in Charles River Reservation, the border road in Middlesex Fells Reservation extending from Highland Avenue to Summer Street in Malden, the border road in Middlesex Fells Reservation extending from Wwoming Avenue in Melrose to the Lynn Fells Parkway, the driveway in Quincy Shore Reservation, the driveway of Lynn Shore Reservation, the driveway of Winthrop Shore Reservation and the driveway of Revere Beach Reservation from Lynnway to Revere Street; and upon the driveway of Revere Beach Reservation from Revere Street to its intersection with Revere Beach Parkway; provided, however, that no automobile or vehicle propelled by other than animal power shall be allowed upon said driveway of Revere Beach Reservation from Revere Street to its intersection with Revere Beach Parkway during the hours from 3 o'clock P.M. to 10 o'clock P.M., inclusive, on the 17th day of June or during said hours on any Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday occurring during the period extending from and including June 17 to and including Labor Day in each year.

RULE 2. No automobile or vehicle propelled by other than animal power shall be allowed within any parkway except Middlesex Fells Parkway, Lynn

Fells Parkway, Revere Beach Parkway, Mystic Valley Parkway, Fresh Pond Parkway, Blue Hills Parkway from Mattapan Square in Boston to Canton Avenue in Milton, Neponset River Parkway, Nahant Beach Parkway, Lynnway, and Furnace Brook Parkway between Adams and Willard Streets.

RULE 3. No person shall drive an automobile or vehicle propelled by other than animal power on any road, driveway or parkway in the care and control of the Metropolitan Park Commission where such automobile or vehicle is allowed at a rate of speed exceeding twenty miles an hour.

RULE 4. No person shall drive an automobile or vehicle propelled by other than animal power except upon the travelled portion of a road, driveway or parkway or upon the portion of beach where such travel is permitted, or upon other than the right-hand side of a road, driveway or parkway except when passing another vehicle or animal, or past a vehicle or animal except to the left thereof, or across a road unless the right of way is given to all other vehicles or animals, or by the side of any vehicle except for the purpose of passing such vehicle, or past a vehicle or animal going in the same direction without sounding a horn or bell.

RULE 5. No person shall stop an automobile or vehicle propelled by other than animal power so as to obstruct a road, driveway or parkway or a sidewalk or crossing thereof, or so as to prevent the passing of other vehicles, or otherwise than lengthwise with a road, driveway or parkway, and close to the sidewalk thereof, and on the right-hand side thereof in such a manner that the front of the automobile or vehicle shall face in the direction in which said automobile or vehicle was moving when brought to a stop.

RULE 6. No person having control of an automobile or vehicle propelled by other than animal power shall neglect or refuse to stop, place, change the position of or move such automobile or vehicle as directed by a police officer.

RULE 7. No person having control of an automobile shall allow the same to stand upon a road, driveway or parkway without some person in charge of the same, or so secured that it cannot be moved except by a person in the control of the mechanism thereof.

RULE 8. No person shall have in his control or operate an automobile or motor vehicle which has about or affixed to any wheel or the tire of any wheel thereof either a chain or rope of metal or other material, upon any road, driveway or parkway in the care or control of the Metropolitan Park Commission, except upon that portion of Blue Hills Parkway lying between Mattapan Square in Boston and Brook Road in Milton, upon the easterly driveway of Middlesex Fells Parkway between Middlesex Avenue in Somerville and Middlesex Avenue in Medford, or upon that portion of Nahant Beach Parkway extending from Washington Street in Lynn to Nahant Road in Nahant and lying westerly and in the rear of the Nahant Beach Bath House.

Any person violating any of the above rules shall for each offence be punished by a fine of not more than twenty dollars. (Revised Laws, Chap. 23, Section 30.)

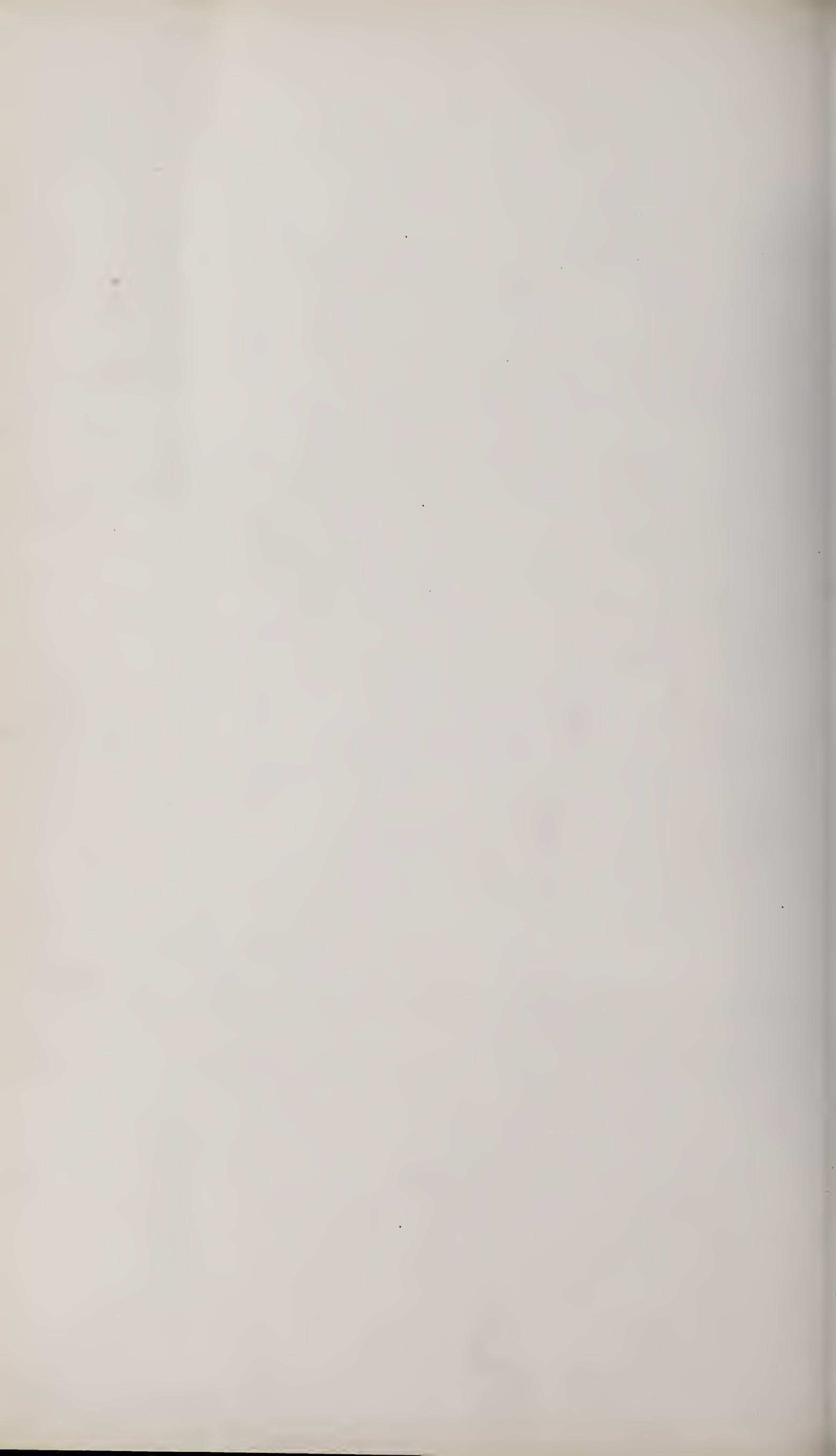

dise, or a vehicle in use for carrying merchandise or articles other than the equipments proper for a pleasure vehicle, or a hearse, or any vehicle in a funeral procession, except upon a traffic road, or to gain access by the shortest way from the nearest street to the front entrance of a house facing on a parkway, boundary road or driveway; provided, however, that no person shall in any event carry or cause to be carried upon any parkway, boundary road or driveway on any vehicle a load the weight whereof exceeds three tons; nor shall any person in any event carry or cause to be carried upon such parkway, boundary road or driveway on any two-wheeled vehicle a load the weight whereof exceeds one ton unless the tires of the wheels of such vehicle are four inches or more in width, nor on any four-wheeled vehicle unless the tires of the front wheels of such vehicle are three inches or more in width and the tires on the rear wheels thereof are four inches or more in width.

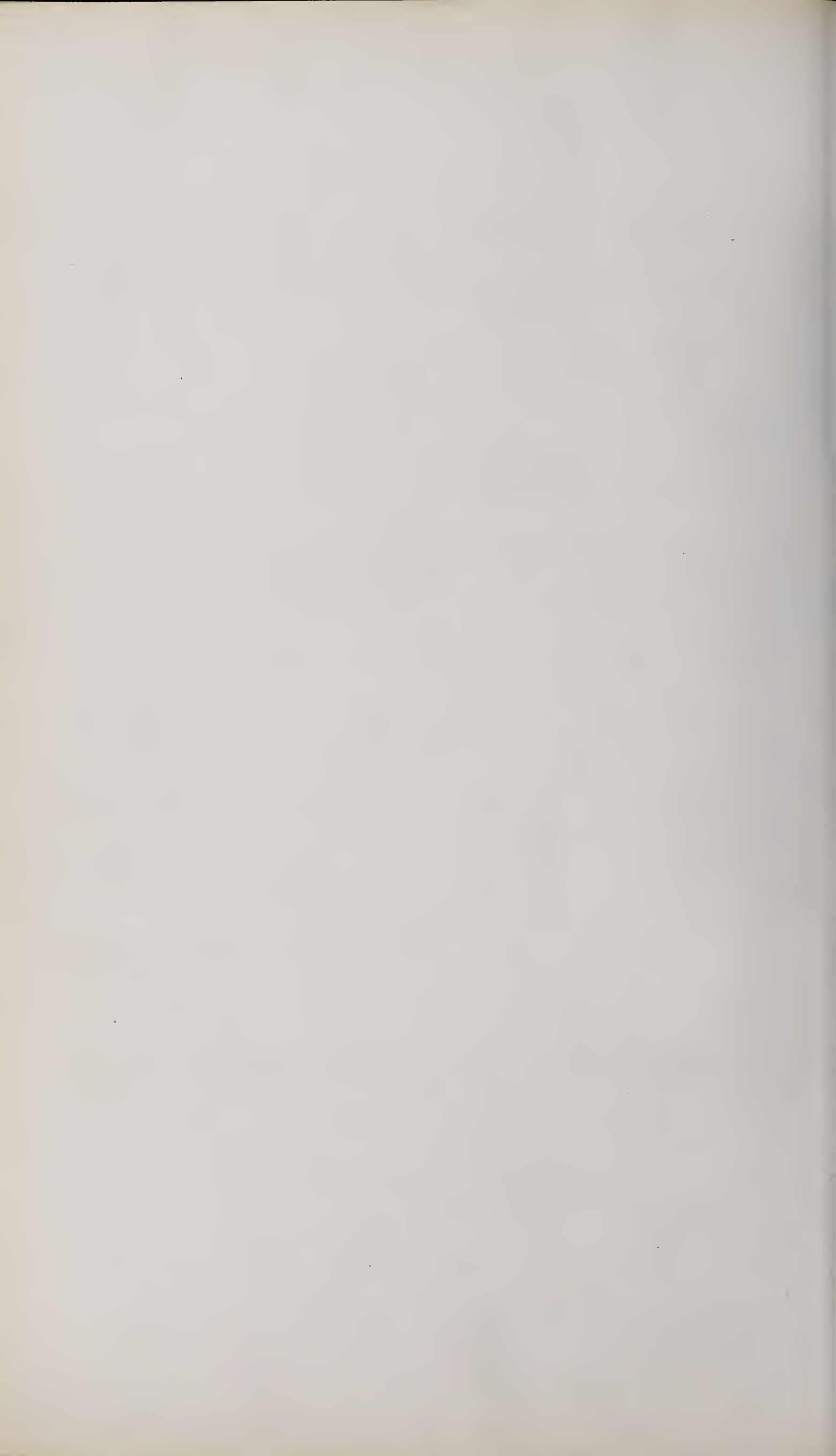

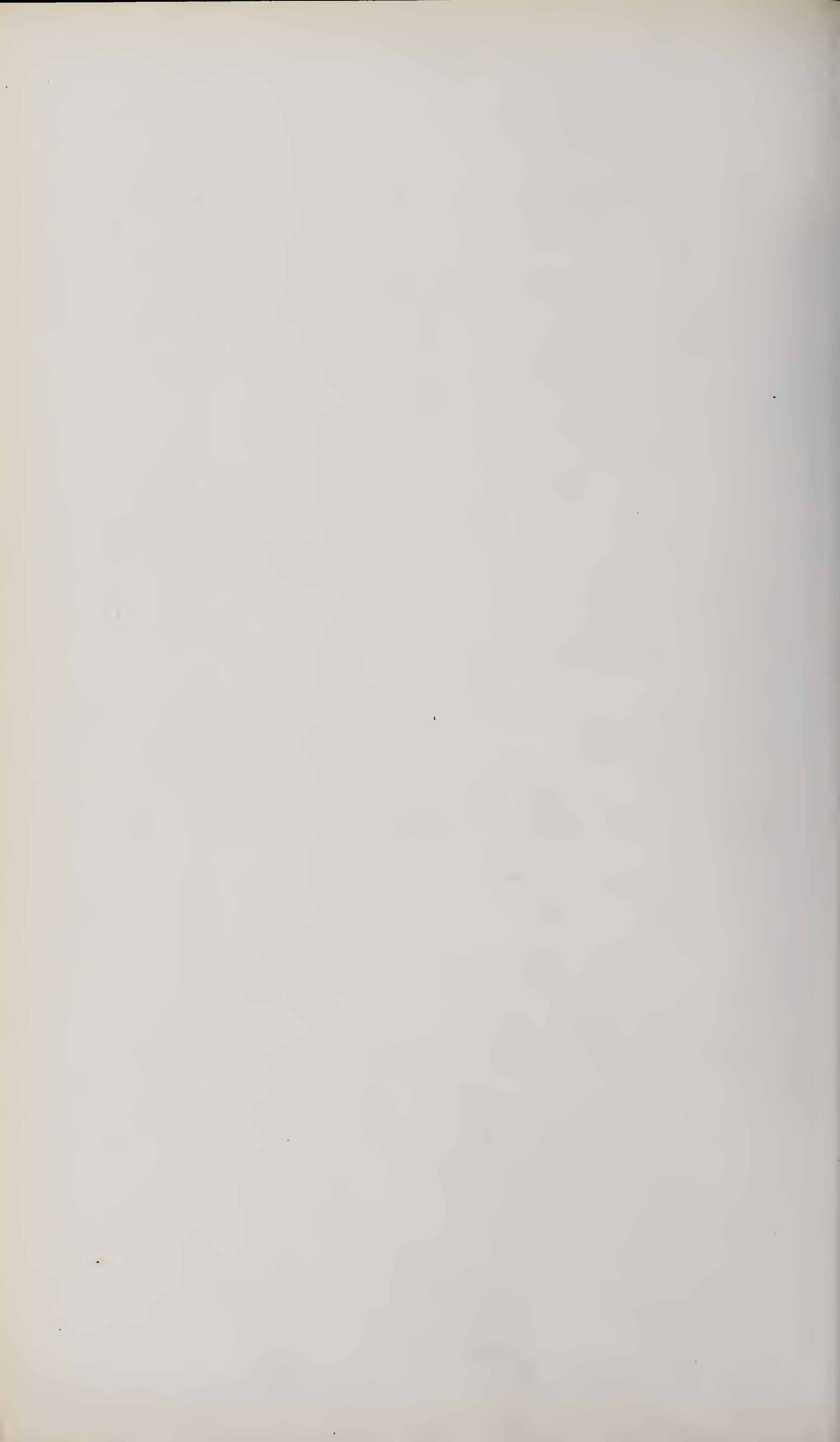
