As she is now featured on the Home Page of The American Sleep Apnea Association (www.sleepapnea.org), my mother gave her life, unknowingly, to bring to light attention on those who suffer from Sleep Apnea.

My mother was born in Ipswich, Massachusetts. A Proclamation is fitting for her contributions to this state and nationally.





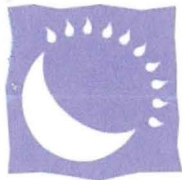

Dear Brian,

On behalf of the American Sleep Apnea Association I send sincere condolences on the death of your mother Helen Bousquet. **Her death was a preventable tragedy.**

The American Sleep Apnea Association is the only national non-profit organization dedicated to reducing injury, disability and **death** (emphasis added) from sleep apnea and to enhances the well-being of those affected by this common disorder.

The association to further its mission of preventing this type of tragedy we have a whole section of the web site to address the issue of anesthesia - <http://tinyurl.com/OSA-Sleep>. We discuss extensively that sleep apnea patients need to have special handling when they are in the hospital or an outpatient surgical facility. The information is there with recommendations of how to care for apnea patients.

What happened to your mother could have been avoided if the hospital had made PAP therapy available to her much sooner and had her where her condition could have been monitored more closely.

It is a terrible thing that happened to your mother, but the association wants to work with you to see how this can be prevented from happening in the future. There is no reason that any diagnosed apnea patient should die while in the hospital, when effective treatment is readily available.

Helen Bousquet did not have to die following routine surgery.

Enclosed is a copy of our newsletter from 2007 that discusses this issue specifically for you to review and share with others.

Please let me know how the ASAA can help you keep this from happening to anyone else.
