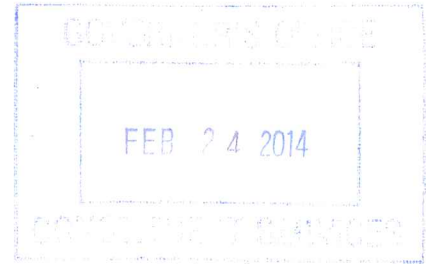

Dear Sir,

On behalf of the Tibetan Association of Boston, which constitutes over 700 local Tibetans, I would like to request a Commonwealth of Massachusetts Proclamation by your Excellency that proclaims March 10, 2014, as the "Tibet Day".

For the last several years, the Commonwealth of Massachusetts has graciously granted March 10th as "Tibet Day", a proclamation that commemorates and supports the Tibetan cause. All Tibetans in Massachusetts, supporters of the Tibetan freedom movement and human rights activist, truly appreciate such recognition by the State and its Governor.

March 10, 2014, marks the 55th anniversary of the Tibetan National Uprising Day, a fateful day in 1959 when Tibetans took to the streets of Lhasa to protest China's invasion and occupation of their country. Despite China's attempts to destroy the Tibetan spirit, Tibetan resistance has continued non-violently for more than one-half of the century inside Tibet and the communities in exile worldwide.

On this momentous occasion, we will be gathering near the State House to pay our heartfelt tribute to the brave men and women who have given up their lives for the cause of freedom and at the same time, offer our prayers for the millions of Tibetans who are currently undergoing untold sufferings under the communist Chinese regime. I would like to request one of your representatives to join us for a few moments on that day and read out the Proclamation to the small crowd that will be gathered that day.
