A Proclamation

His Excellency Governor Deval L. Patrick

Whereas Hispanic Americans continue to be a vital part of the Commonwealth's rich diversity by contributing significantly to all aspects of daily life, including education, medicine, commerce, agriculture, public service, technology, and the arts; and

Whereas Hispanic Americans make up over ten percent of the Massachusetts population; and

Whereas Hispanic Americans trace their heritage to a diverse group of nations and the close cultural, social, and economic ties between these countries and the Commonwealth promise to expand and strengthen as we continue through the 21st century; and

Whereas The nations of Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, Mexico, and Chile celebrate their independence between the dates of September 15 and September 18; and

Whereas Hispanic owned businesses, including enterprises from neighborhood storefronts to multinational corporations, are vital to the economic growth, wealth and job creation in the Commonwealth; and

Whereas It is appropriate that all residents recognize Hispanic Americans for their many contributions to the cities and towns across our Commonwealth,

Now, Therefore, I, Deval L. Patrick, Governor of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, do hereby proclaim September 15, 2013 until October 15, 2013 to be,

HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH

And urge all the citizens of the Commonwealth to take cognizance of this event and participate fittingly in its observance.
