Your letter of the 23rd/and I read it very carefully. I am unable to understand why the American Sheet & Tin Plate Company require you to give a bond in the amount of \$150. for seven years. They have undoubtedly the number of the check which they issued to you and all that is necessary for them to do is to stop payment on the check at the bank. That would, therefore, make it impossible for any person to collect the money on the check. If I were you, I would insist that they give you a check or cash for the amount of \$76.65 and they should instruct the bank to stop payment on the check given to you which you lost.
